**Lived Long in Pembroke.**  
Thomas Clark, Pembroke, died on Sunday, aged ninety-one years. In 1866 he located in Pembroke and carried on a dry goods business. In 1896 he was made collector of inland revenue there holding office up to 1916 when he retired. He was a Liberal, Orangeman and Presbyterian. He served for years as chairman of the Board of Education. Three sons and two daughters survive.

**Hon. Mr. Nickle's Bills.**  
Hon. W. F. Nickle's bill in the legislature to amend the Ontario Railway Act, makes any passenger on an electric or street railway who refuses to pay his fare liable to a penalty not exceeding \$10.

Another bill by Mr. Nickle sets forth that, where a trial is transferred from one county to another county the cost is to be borne by the county from which the trial is transferred, not the county to which it is transferred.

**Held a Euchre Party.**  
A large number of the members of the Daughters and Maids of England and their friends held an enjoyable euchre party at the home of their worthy president, Mrs. Eastwell, John street, on Wednesday evening. The first prize for the ladies was won by Miss Beatrice Penfold, and Charles Selby captured the gentlemen's prize. After these presentations dainty refreshments were served by the ladies and a very pleasant evening was brought to a close.

**For Benefit of Smokers.**  
The passenger department of the Canadian National Railway, looking to the pleasure of their passengers, especially smokers, are eliminating the old-time smoking compartment on day trains wherever possible, and are placing a special smoking car on the trains. The change will be very welcome, and will dispose of the cramped stales

at the ends of the cars now used by smokers.

**Hastings War Tribute.**  
Twenty-five trees, ten feet apart, on the main street of the village, bear the names of Hastings' boys who fell in the Great War. The trees were planted three years ago under the auspices of the I.O.D.E. of the village, and on Saturday last arrangements were made for the unveiling of a monument, which, with the trees, will complete Hastings' tribute to its sons.

The late Mr. Gowdy and wife, Mary Letty, who died three or four years ago, were well known to many at Bloomfield and Wellington, as they from time to time visited Friends' meetings there. Those who knew them could not but admire the way they travelled from Moscow to the meetings at Thirteen Island Lake and Echo Lake for about thirty years, over terribly rough roads. They travelled forty or fifty miles each week-end and conducted religious meetings. Since the death of Mary Letty, Mr. Gowdy was not quite the same in health, although he continued to visit the meetings. He attended Friends' Quarterly Meeting in Wellington two months ago. He died at the home of his

daughter, Mrs. Byard Lee, Winton, at the age of seventy-one.
