Ice Piles Seven Feet. A spectacular ice jam has formed along the south shore of the St. Lawrence river east of Point Airy. and about 100 feet off the American shore. The ice is piled up to a height of seven feet in some places and views of the Canadian shore and Chimney Island are cut off. The jam was caused by large floes sweeping around Point Airy, and being carried by the current against the shore ice. The jam does not threaten to result in any damage present.
