SLASH INCOME TAXES.

Democrats Force Their Measure Through First Vote. Washington, Feb. 21 .- Aided by group of Republicans, most of them

insurgents. House Democrats eliminated from the revenue bill the Mellon income tax rates. By a vote of 222 to 196 a schedule advanced by Representative Garner, Democrat, McBride. Texas, was substituted.

The bill as amended fixes the surtax maximum at 44 per cent, on incomes in excess of \$92,000. against 50 per cent. on incomes exceeding \$200,000 under existing law. and 25 per cent. on incomes of more than \$100,000, as recommended by the Treasury. 
