Rabbi Brickner and himself were merely presentinf the cases as they had seen them and considered them and the audience might do the rest.

The bishop embodied his address in four points. He summed it all up by saying: "I am in favor of the proposal to teach religion in our schools-first, because I believe religious training and instruction of our future citizens to be a matter of national importance for the welfare of our country. Secondly, I do not believe that morality and good citizenship can be taught without a foundation of religion. Thirdly, that I therefore hold that the schools of the nation should be places in which the atmosphere is distinctly religious, and where religion is definitely taught. Fourthly, I believe that religion will never have the proper value and estimation that it ought to possess in the minds of the publie at large, and more particularly of the children, till the same importance is attached to it in our schools
