ment that if this proposal were carried out perfection would ensue at once nor Utopia arrive in a few short years. But I believe that it would be of immense benefit to the coming generations of citizens. It is admittedly a most thorny and difficult subject with which to deal. One has only to come to close quarters with those difficulties, as I have done, to be impressed with their magnitude. Much patience, prolonged discussions, wide-spread interchange of ideas and thought are inseparable preliminaries. Some would say that it is not even a live question and certainly not at present within the range of practical politics. This latter assertion may be true. Yet, at the same time there is undoubtedly in the minds of many at the present time, who are by no means disposed to take an unduly pessimistic view, a certain misgiving as to the results of our present system in connection with the general standards of life and conduct they see prevailing. Such people are ready to consider with an open mind any proposed course of action which would tend to remove these misgivings, including that which is advocated in this address. However far from realization it may be at present, I do not think that it can simply be dismissed as a dead issue so long as a number of thinking people are interested in it, and are willing to work towards it. One thing is clear to me. Such a change ought never to provoke resentment of bitterness. It can only be brought about by mutual goodwill. I may personally never see it, but none the less I believe it will eventually come and that when it comes it will be an inestimable benefit to our country."

Both speakers were tendered appreciative remarks by the president and a very hearty vote of thanks from the association before the adjournment for lunch.

RUSHING TO FIUME.

To Break Marriage Ties Before Italian Law Intervenes.

Rome, Feb. 23.—Italy's annexation of Fiume, set for next month, has struck dismay into hundreds of couples longing for freedom from the marriage tie. For years the unhappy married have flocked to Fiume to get that city's citizenship and obtain divorce under the easy going Hungarian laws.

In the last few months, because of the settlement between Jugoslavia and Italy, the rush of petitioners has trebled, for Italian law will soon apply to Fiume and Italy while granting separation, forbids divorce.

A general horror of divorce as meaning the break up of family life is deeply rooted in the Italian mind. During one of former Premier Giolitti's administrations a threat from the Chamber of Deputies to present a divorce bill brought the Premier over two million protests in ten days.
