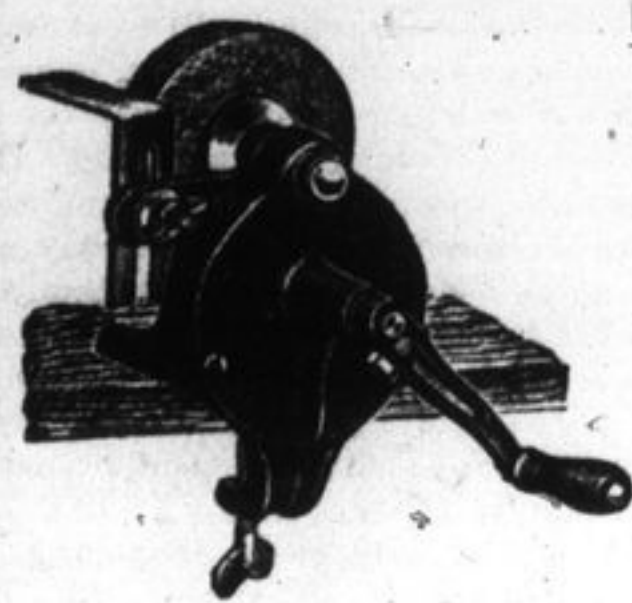

BUNDOCK NOT AT TRIAL

Judge Wills Dismisses Action He Brought With Costs.

Stirling, March 7.—At the sittings of the Division Court before Judge Wills, an action of "Rev." Elijah Bundock against Hugh Stewart on a promissory note was on the list for hearing.
