Man-Made Quakes Test Building's Stability

Tests to determine the type of building best adapted to withstand earthquakes are made on a machine which reproduces, with realistic intensity, the horizontal and vertical vibrations caused by a genuine tremor. The device is the invention of two Japanese professors, and consists of a platform on which a model house is constructed on a reduced scale. The base is then made to sway and shake as the surface of the earth does in a seismic disturbance, by means of levers. The longer the house is able to withstand the vibrations, the better suited it is to resist the earthquake's power. Results of the recent disaster and of many previous occurrences like it, have proved that buildings, having rapidly increased in height, have frequently caused more damage than the actual vibrations of the earth. A type of construction that will be immune in heavy shocks is sought by builders in countries where such disturbances are likely to occur.

Laughter-Proof Tribe Found in Wilds of Ceylon

For more than 2000 years, it is said, laughter has been unknown to the Vedias, a tribe of aboriginal inhabitants of Ceylon, who have maintained a secluded existence in caves and jungles of the region. Cut off from other peoples and subsisting on bats, owls, and crows that they shoot with arrows, these strange people are said to have lost entirely the sensation of laughter. They are thin and flabby, and a fat man is unknown to them. Efforts of a scientist, who recently visited them, to produce smiles by tickling them on the soles of their bare feet or in the ribs, met with no success. Their stony countenances did not even winkle.

Women Play Part in Building of Modern Skyscrapers

That the needs of women must be given as much attention as is accorded the sinking of the foundations of a modern skyscraper, is disclosed in the report of the National Association of Building Owners and Managers. This consideration is reflected chiefly in planning for adequate and attractive rest rooms which, it is declared, can no longer be classed as luxuries. Also human frailties must be taken into consideration, including the habits of messenger boys penciling corridors and jumping down the stairs. The pencil habit has given rise to the term "pencil line" for the height of marble wainscoting, which is raised to such a level that marks may be easily cleaned from the walls. Awning fires are being prevented through dipping of the fabric in a fire-proofing substance.

"Automatic" Car Jack

When working on the rear end of an automobile, or under it, it is usually necessary to jack up one end of the car to provide more space to work. The illustration shows a pair of simple homemade jacks for this purpose. They are made of 2 by 6-in. unplanned lumber, and constructed as shown in the upper figure, each consisting of a 2 by 6-in. beam, two support blocks, and a top board of the same material. The top board is pivoted on one of the support blocks by means of a piece of 1/4-in. iron pipe, loosely held in place by large staples; it must be about twice as long as the base and beveled at one end as shown, this end being slightly heavier than the other so that the board will fall to the position indicated in the upper figure.



A hook is provided on one support block to keep the top board down, and a short length of iron pipe or rod, fitting loosely in holes drilled through the sides of the top, prevents the wheels from running off the jack while the work is being done, thus making the work perfectly safe.

Lloyd's Is Moving

Lloyd's, the greatest shipping organization in the world, after occupying quarters in the Royal Exchange, London, Eng., for one hundred and fifty years, is to move to a new building of its own in Leadenhall street. It is a great wrench—one does not give up a tenancy that has lasted 150 years without a pang. But sentiment has had to be put aside in face of the fact that the corporation has long had hardly room to breathe in its old quarters.

Lloyd's sprang from a coffee-house opened in 1688 by Edward Lloyd, a Welshman, of an independent turn of mind, in Tower street, a neighborhood, as Stow reported, "replenished with Sea-faring Persons."

The merchants and underwriters and brokers who foregathered at Lloyd's found there good cheer and the best commercial intelligence of the day. Gradually they formed themselves into an organized body which came in time to take on the status and powers of a legal corporation for the conduct of "the business of insurance of every description."

Marine insurance is still, as it has been for nearly 250 years, the main concern of the members of Lloyd's. But it is no longer the exclusive concern. The past twelve years have seen the development of a huge and profitable insurance business for war risks, fire, aircraft, accident, employers' liability, jewelry, motor cars, burglary, and so on, transacted by the members of Lloyd's in accordance with the rules of the society.

There are at present slightly over 1,000 underwriting members. Each has to deposit with the committee before election securities to the value of at least \$25,000. These investments are held by trustees under deeds which make them exclusively available for the discharge of underwriting liabilities contracted at Lloyd's.

Each member, again is legally responsible for any engagements he may enter into under Lloyd's policies to the full extent of all his worldly possessions. In other words, his liability is unlimited. His accounts are audited annually by approved auditors, who forward to the committee a certificate that his underwriting assets and security are sufficient to meet his liabilities. If he engages in fire and other non-marine business he has to furnish a separate guarantee or cash deposit each year for an amount equal to the premiums he has received.

The personal responsibility of each underwriter is one of the fundamental rules of Lloyd's. But it is supplemented by the resources and facilities of the whole corporation. The results is that every thing that can

be done to give security to a policy of insurance is done at Lloyd's as nowhere else in the world.

Lloyd's itself does no insured business any more than the Stock Exchange, as such, buys or sells securities. What it does is to provide those who want to do insurance business with a place to meet in, information to assist them, and rules to guide their transactions.

For that purpose there is a Lloyd's agent or sub-agent, to the number of over 1,500, in every port and on every coast, throughout the globe. By telegram and wireless and signal stations Lloyd's is kept informed every minute of the day, and night of the movements of all ocean-going ships and of all casualties.

Not one vessel in ten thousand ever reaches a British port without being reported to Lloyd's, and the information is so speedily and perfectly indexed that any member can ascertain with hardly more than a glance the exact whereabouts of any given ship, the dates of her arrivals and sailings, where she was last spoken with, and any incident of her voyage that may concern him to know.

Besides this Lloyd's publishes daily and weekly papers and a large number of reports and compilations, and registers dealing with one or another aspect of marine insurance. It has brought method, uniformity and fixed principles over vast areas of insurance practice. Lloyd's forms are the standard forms in virtually universal use, and "the custom of Lloyd's" is recognized and accepted in and out of the law courts as the basis of marine insurance. It is honored throughout the world as the greatest of all shipping organizations and one of the foremost agencies of international trade, with an enviable record of patriotic munificence.

Stranded Inland

In the last serious eruption, which occurred in the south of the main island of Japan, vessels of several hundred tons were carried a quarter of a mile inland by the tidal wave.
