BASKETBALL Passing The Ball

"Get rid of the ball" is good advice because basketball is a team work game. The ball invites trouble and many games are lost because the ball is held too long before passing. The short, fast passes are one of the most interest-

ing features of the game. Holding the ball will be eliminated if the quick pass game is



played but it means that the players will have to "keep loose" from a guard and keep moving. Pass the ball in such a way that your player can reach it before the opponentif possible, so your man is between

the ball and his opponent. Pass it also in a way that the player may make his next move quickly, without awkwardness. Do not pass it in such a way that time must be lost in catching, or so that the one who receives it must slow up to

The two-handed snappy pass is better than the one-handed pass. The diagram shows the two-handed pass being used. It insures accuracy and can be made more quickly since the ball can be received and passed on with the same motion. It is passed with a wrist and elbow move-

ment from the chest. A one-handed pass may be made longer and with greater force, but the quick pass is far more in use. If there is a real good chance to use this long pass do not hesitate to do so. Do not let the long pass become a habit, however.
