**Transferred to Haldimand.**  
C. C. Main, of the Ontario De-

Lake, Sask. Dr. Chant is the only

Lakefield, Ont.

**To Assist in Immigration.**  
Rev. Father Quilly, Douglas, ex-  
pects to leave during April or May,  
for a two years' stay in Ireland. It  
is understood that Father Quilly  
will assist in the organization of im-  
migration of Irish farmers to Can-  
ada.

**Dismissed With Costs.**  
In the case of Cokers vs. City of  
Belleville an action to recover \$2,-  
000 damages for injuries received  
from a fall on sidewalk alleged to  
be dangerous and unsafe through  
defendants' neglect, the action was  
dismissed with costs.

**Transferred to Smith's Falls.**  
John Lowe, who has been em-  
ployed as telephone repair man, with  
headquarters in Carleton Place for  
several years, has been transferred  
to Smith's Falls, from which point  
he will work in future. He moved  
his family to Smith's Falls.

**Gift From a Club.**  
C. R. Lucas has left Lansdowne  
for Acton, where he has been ap-  
pointed accountant in the Bank of  
Montreal. Before leaving Lans-  
downe he was presented with an  
address and handsome pipe, by the  
Young People's Club of the Anglican  
church.

**Strained His Back.**  
Thomas Boyne, an employee of  
the W. G. Craig Company, fell down  
several steps while carrying a case  
of goods on Wednesday and severely  
strained his back. An X-ray exami-  
nation by Dr. Quigley showed that  
no bones were broken. Mr. Boyne
