RUSSELL GRAVES NOT TO BE EXTRADITED
 He is a Canadian citizen and United States Will Not Get Him.
 Russell Graves, alias Russell Moulten, has won out in his fight against extradition.
 Graves was being held at the police station, at the request of the American authorities. He was wanted in Detroit, Mich., to answer to a charge of violating his parole, but he refused to go across the border voluntarily, stating that he was a Canadian and that he had served his term in the States.
 The prisoner, it will be recalled, was re-arrested on Saturday afternoon, as he walked out of the Portsmouth penitentiary, where he had completed a term. When he refused to go across the border, the American authorities took the matter up with Ottawa, with the result that a wire was received by the local police on Wednesday, asking for the release of Graves at the latter, in company with a relative left on the midnight train for Toronto.
 Graves was arrested on a charge of pocket-picking in the States and was given a term of from one to five years. He served one year and was allowed out on parole. He came to Canada, got into trouble again and was sentenced to a term in the Portsmouth penitentiary.
 The American authorities kept tabs on Graves and when he was given his liberty on Saturday, had the local police take him in charge. From the very start Graves put up a fight and secured Adrian Revelle as his lawyer.
 The American authorities state that Graves gave his home as Buffalo, N.Y., and this led them to believe that he was an American citizen.
