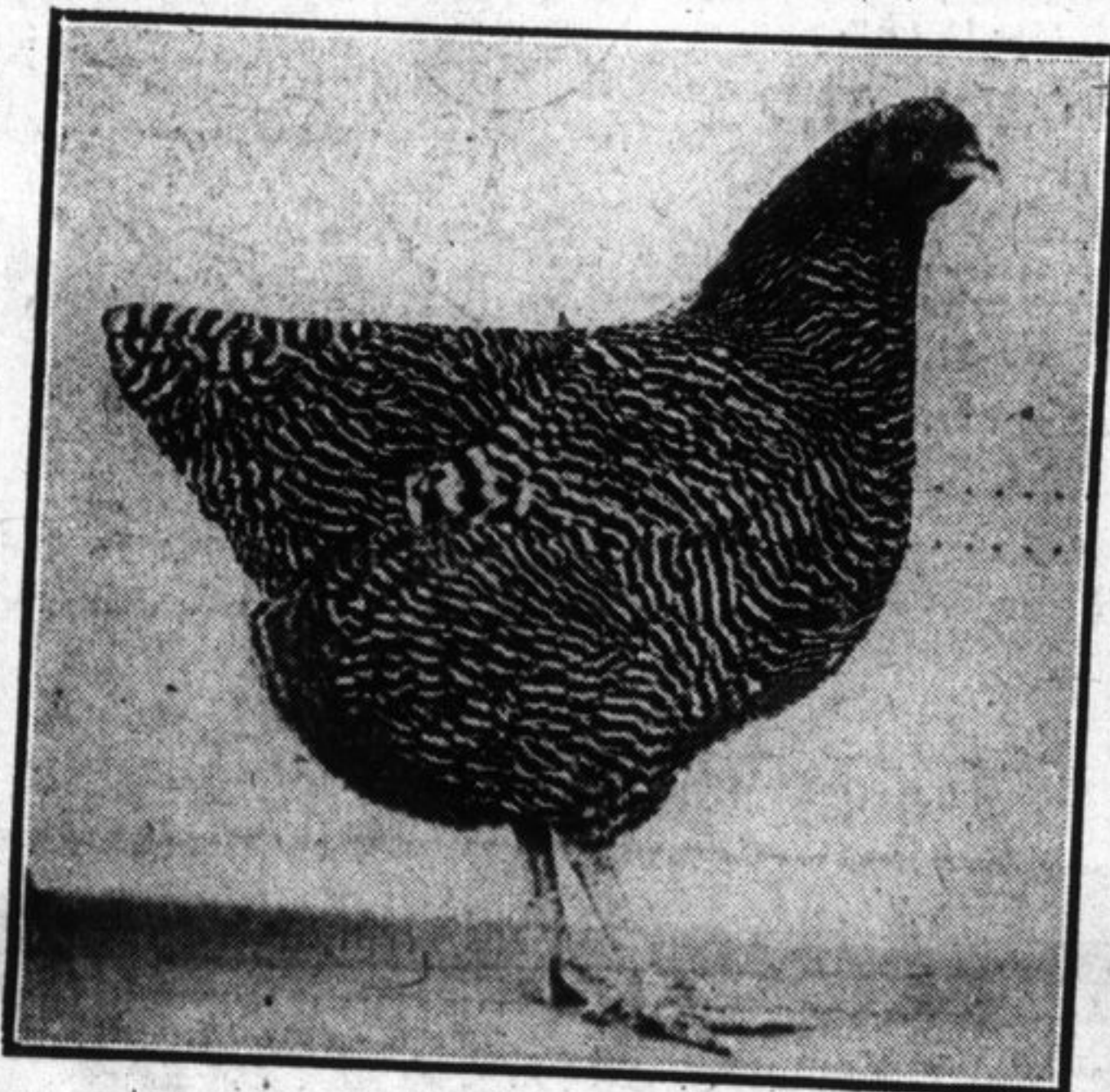

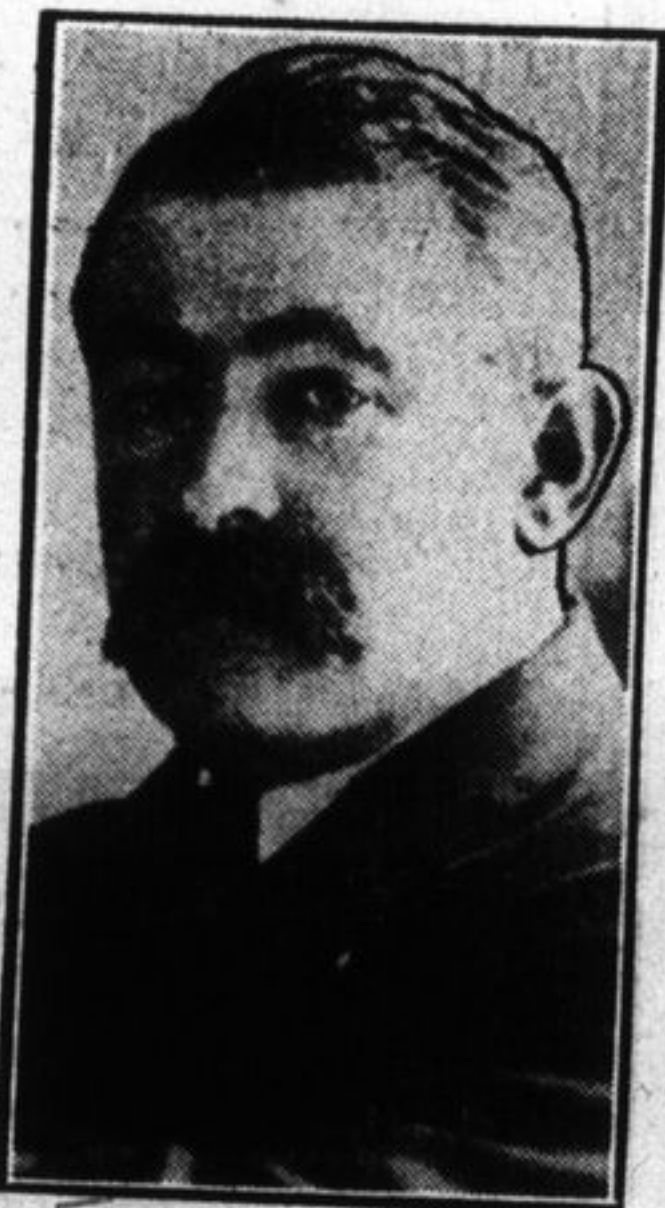

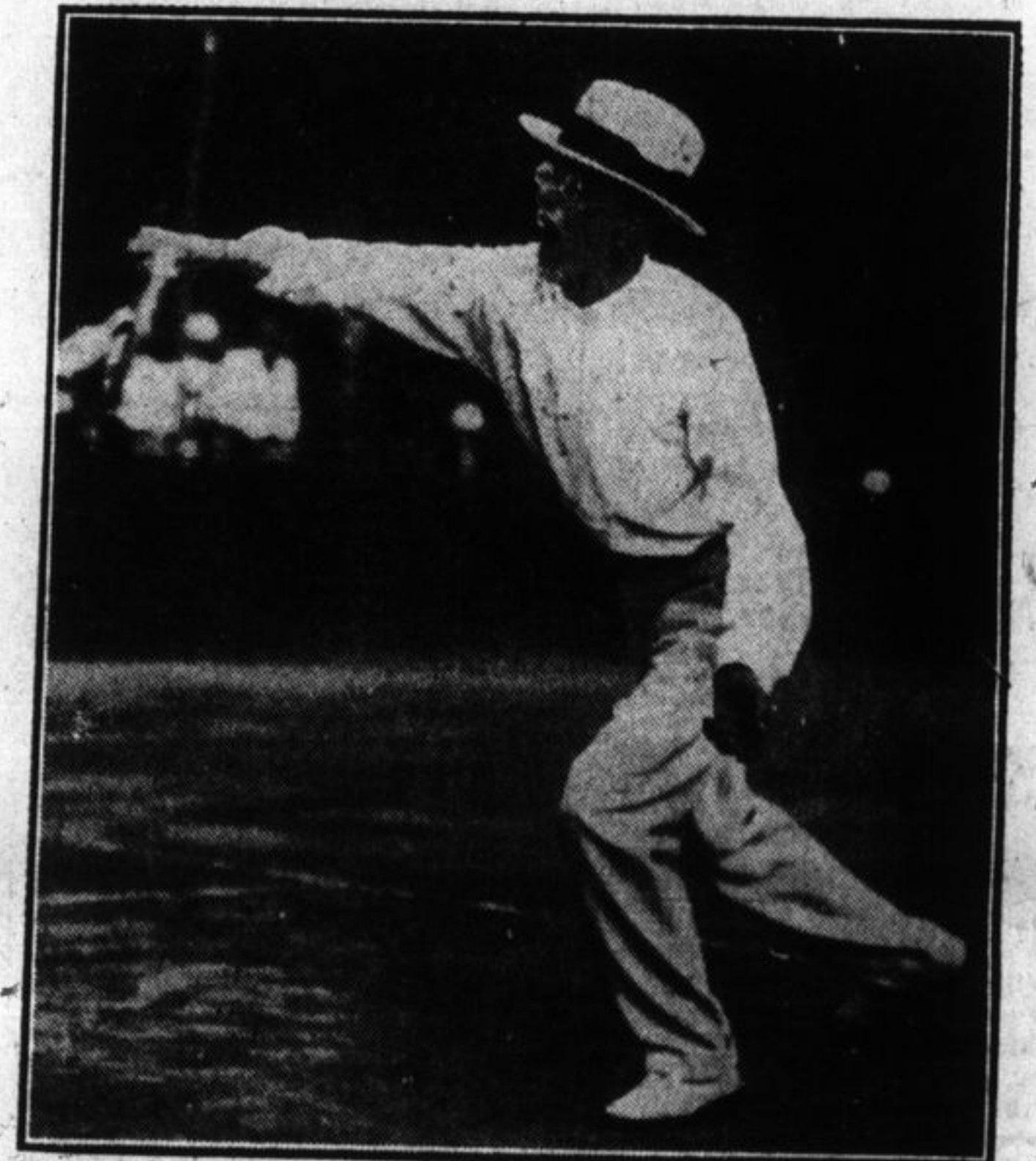

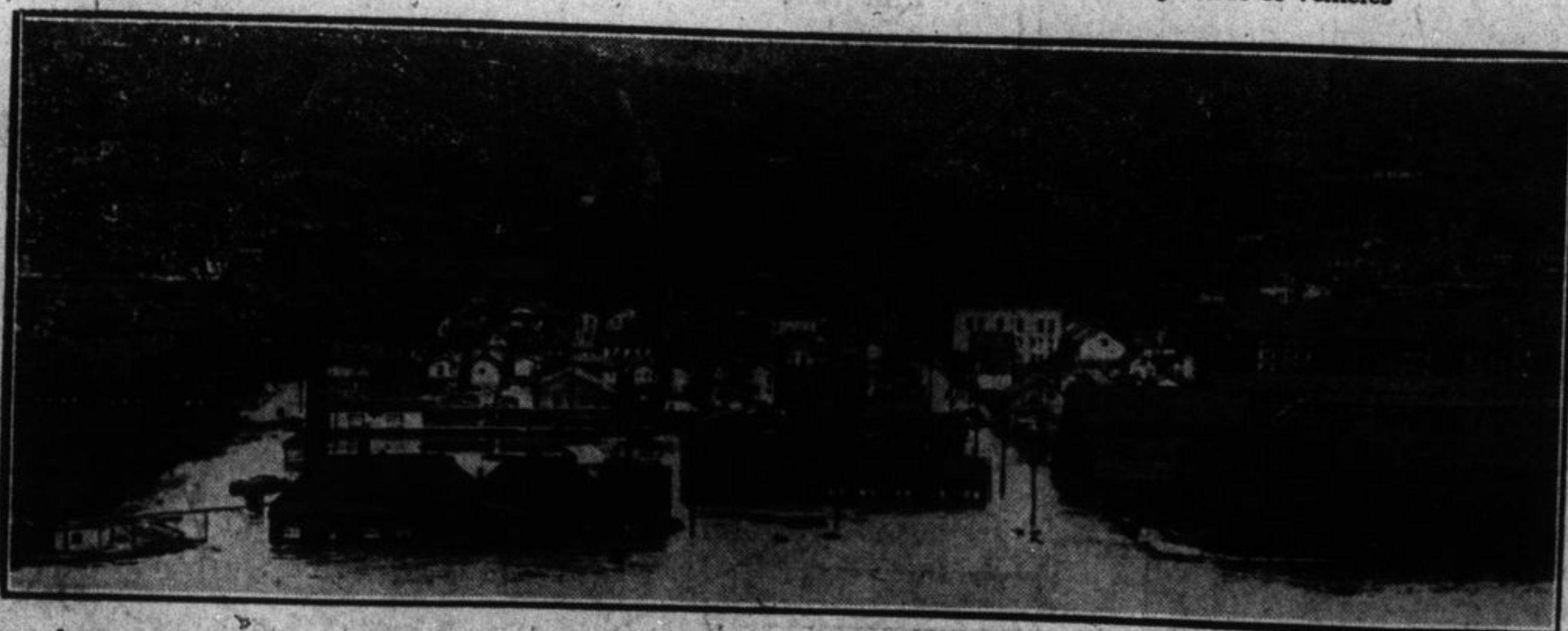

Prince Wolfgang Wildhof, nephew of the former kaiser of Germany, is returning to his own country after a month's business trip on this continent



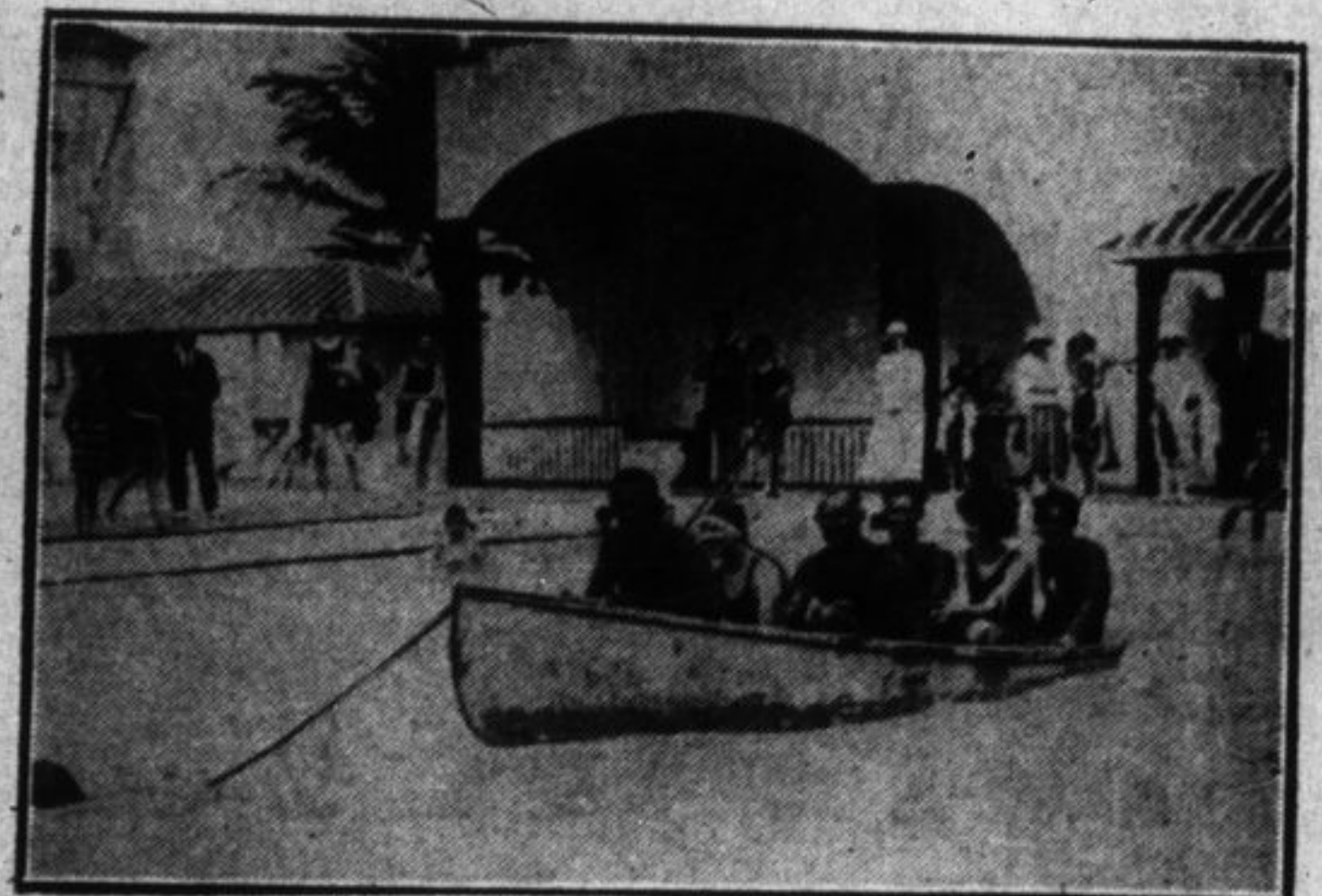
