While not directly connected with Pembroke himself, the promotion of L. A. Downs, of Savannah, Ga., to the position of president of the Central of Georgia Railway Company, a subsidiary line of the Illinois Central, is of considerable interest to citizens of Pembroke through the fact that Mr. Downs chose as his companion in life a Pembroke lady, Miss Ida Mulligan, who for fifty years operated two boats on the Upper Ottawa.

Attorney Ford Improved.
The condition of Attorney L. H. Ford, Clayton, who has been seriously ill with pneumonia for the past ten days, is reported to be much improved. Mr. Ford was stricken a week ago and was in a critical condition for several days. His heart was apparently weakened by his severe illness but it is thought that he is better now.

Cabs in Kingston.
On Tuesday, April 8th an article appeared in the Whig to the effect that there were only three horse driven cabs on the stand in Kingston at the present time. L. Gues, liveryman, states that he has four wheel hacks and four sleigh hacks, and Godkin's livery also has a number available for service. It is stated that there are about fifteen hacks available in Kingston. The hacks now in service are first class in every respect.

A Deceptive Advertisement.
Several immigrants who have recently arrived in Canada to find that jobs have not been very plentiful, have made the statement that they had been advised in England before leaving for Canada that there was plenty of work on the farms over here. A copy of the Gloucester Journal under the date of March 22nd shows to the effect that an advertisement under the name of J. B. Ardale, Canadian Government emigration agent, which stated that "there is no unemployment on the farms in Canada; Canada wants men to cultivate her rich unsettled land; women for house work in the homes; youths and boys to train as farmers and capital to develop her enormous resources."
The recent arrivals state that when they are advised to come to Canada they are not told that the Canadian farmers demand exper-

enced workers and they think that when they arrive the farmers will take them under their wing.

Veteran School Teacher Dead.
The death took place at Geleit, Hastings county, of John R. Stewart, following a brief illness from pleurisy and bronchial pneumonia. Deceased was born on Dec. 11th, 1879, in Sheffield township, and was the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. J. G. Stewart. After leaving public school he attended high school and model at Napanee and Albert College at Belleville and followed the profession of teaching for a number of years, principally in Lennox and Addington counties. For the past eighteen years he lived at Geleit, teaching the village school and later conducting a general store. Deceased was an Anglican and a Liberal and at the time of his death was municipal clerk and High Chief Ranger of the Canadian Order of Foresters. He leaves a wife, who was Miss Florence Lane, Denbigh; two children, Annie, Minden Continuation school, and Rex at home, four children having predeceased him; also his parents, Mr. and Mrs. J. G. Stewart, of Actinolite, Ont.
