A Busy Week.

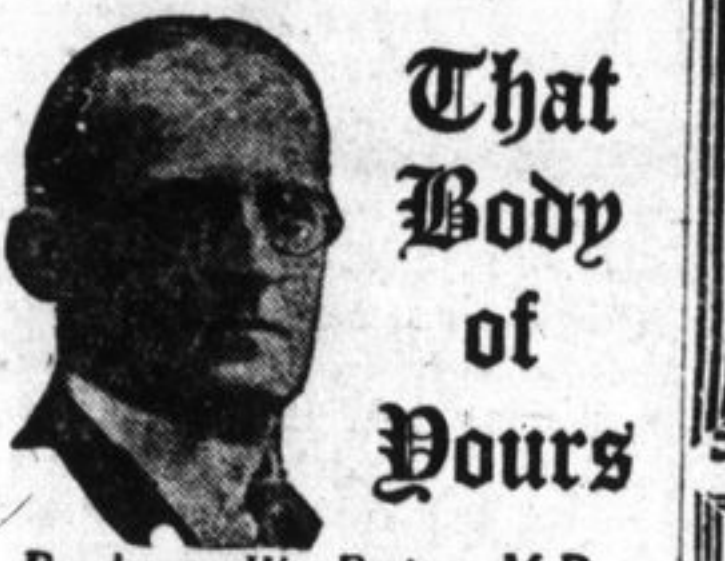
