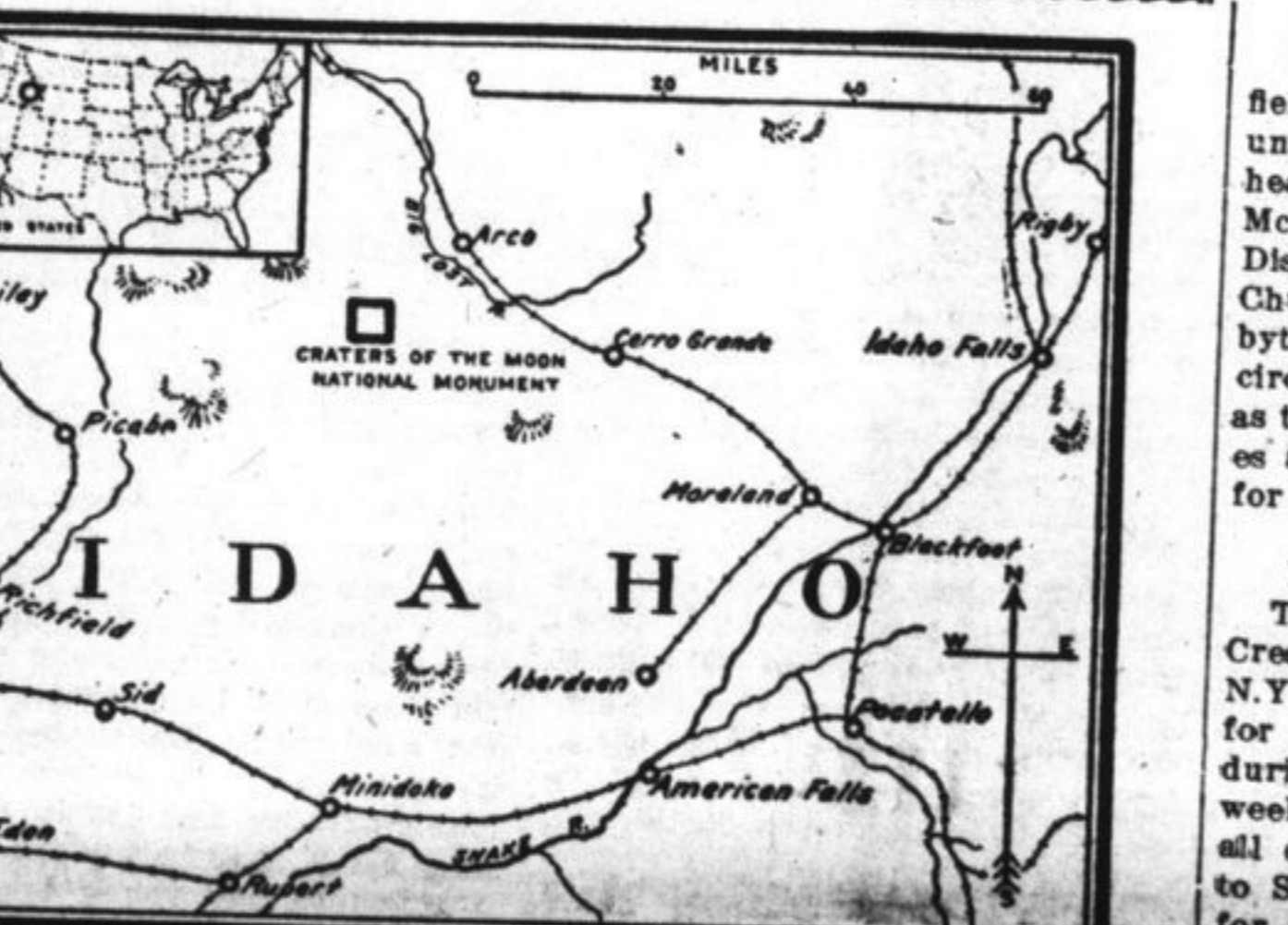
Bishop's Mills is a Discourager.
