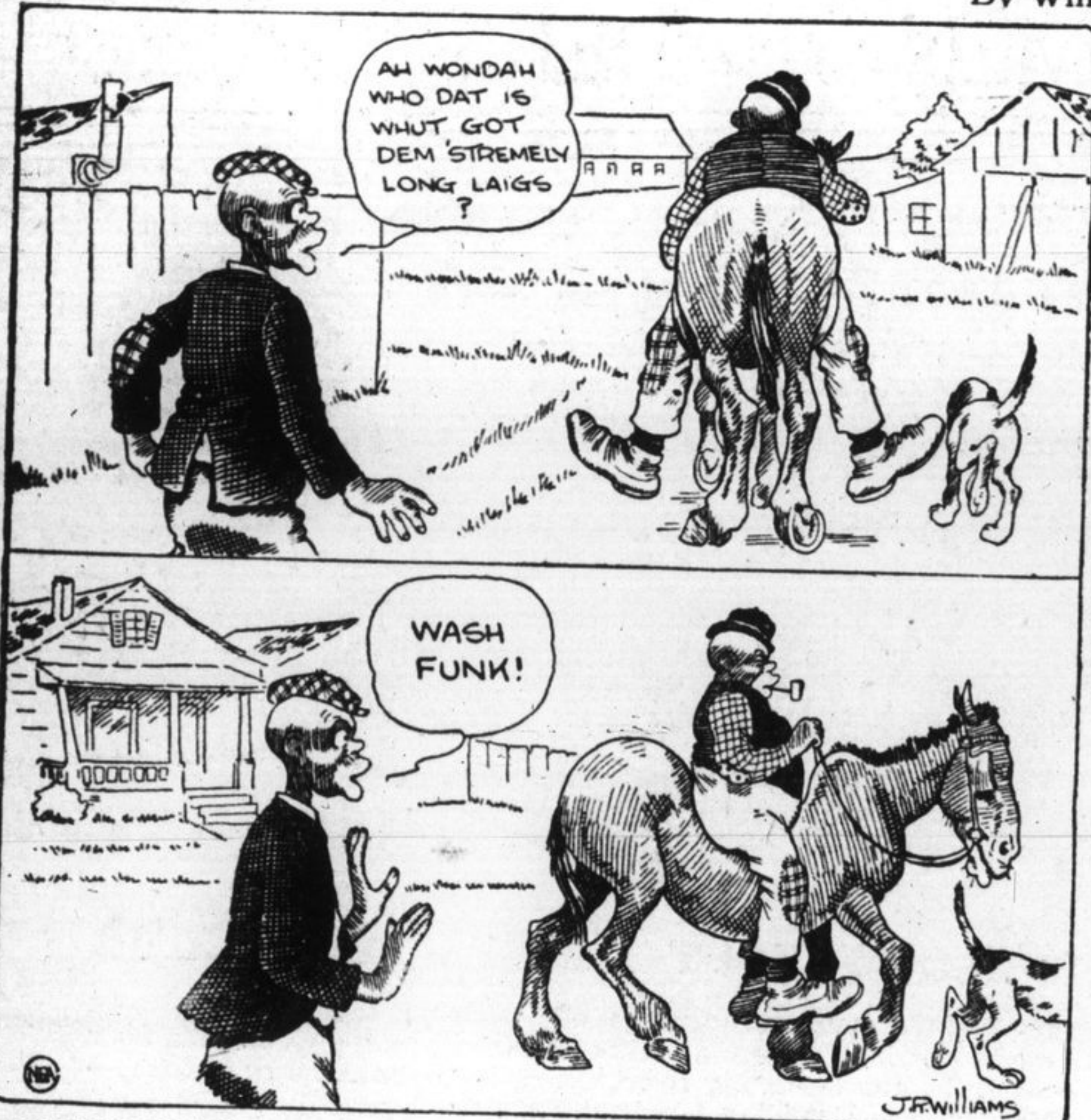

**KINGSTON.**  
Cataragui, May 5.—Members all present. Minutes of last meeting adopted. All secretaries of school sections to notify the clerk the amount of money they need for trustee requirements by the 30th of June. Any school section failing will not receive the special rate. The acting clerk instructed to procure 100 trustee requisition requirements for schools. Mrs. Gunning to receive \$1 per week during May. Deputy-Reeve Cordukes to arrange with Ernest-town council to inspect culvert on town line complained of by Walter Babcock. Mrs. Babcock to be allowed one-half her taxes in full payment for 1923. Council granted \$35 to township school fair to assist in stock judging. C. O. Martin authorized to expend \$15 on town line, Ernesttown to pay like amount. Council decided to repair roads complained of, namely Sydenham Road and Bath Road and charge the same back to the Kingston Suburban Commission; also repair road from Westbrook to Collins Bay. The reeve and clerk to procure agreements for Messrs. MacRow and Tolles, tractor to be 20.40 for grading, from T. I. Rigney and bond \$500 for each. Reeve Graham and Councillors Aylesworth and Gordon named as a committee to arrange and build the vault. A bill for repairing road, damaged by water which was caused by road being graded and ditch not being opened after grading, ordered paid. Miss Walter to be paid \$19 granted her by council and charged to snow account. Hydro Electric paid \$46.13 for three months ending March 31st. B. Robson and F. Tolles paid for digging ditch on Road Div. 20A, \$13.50. Bill for shovelling snow on Road Div. 54, \$24.70, paid. Bill for shovelling snow on Road Div. 21A, \$26.90, paid. Am. Saunders paid \$3 for work done around hall. Bill marked O.K. by council be paid. Joseph Wise paid for groceries given to Mrs. S. Gunning for charity and for supplies as per bill. Hermon Emmons paid \$12.60 for breaking Road Div. 18A. Other bills paid: \$158.25, D. Hartman, repair to house. Div. 21A; \$5.25, R. Holsgrove, fixing drain D.C.; \$12.60, Alex Smyth, snow shovelling; \$13.50, Robson & Tolles, digging ditch on Road Div. 20A. Council adjourned until the first Monday in June at 10 o'clock. Court of Revision.

### What Determines Paint Value?

Paint value cannot be determined by the price per gallon.

It must be found in the extent to which it will cover and in the length of time which it will protect and preserve.

The real value of a paint is therefore arrived at on the value of service given annually per square foot or per thousand square feet. In other words, it is necessary to find the yearly cost of paint per thousand square feet.

Low-priced paint, covering 300-350 square feet, and lasting not more than two years, invariably gives the highest annual cost.

The highest priced paint, covering 500 square feet, and lasting at least four years, undoubtedly gives the greatest annual service value per thousand square feet.

From a decorative standpoint, the higher priced paint has more permanent colors, gives a better finish and retains a more lasting appearance.
