WHY THE WEATHER? DR. CHARLES F. BROOKS Secretary, American Meteorological Society, Tells How.

Criss-Cross Winds. The wind at the ground is practically always different in direction and speed from that at heights of 2 to 4 miles. Above 4 miles, our winds are prevalently westerly, controlled by the general temperature and pressure-gradient from equator to poles, and turned to the right by the earth's rotation.

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Cleaning the Coffee Percolator. Coffee percolators occasionally become clogged and all efforts to open up the fine holes by scrubbing and washing are usually futile. A good method of doing the work is to hold the percolator in a gas flame for a few minutes and then tap it lightly; this will open all the holes at once.

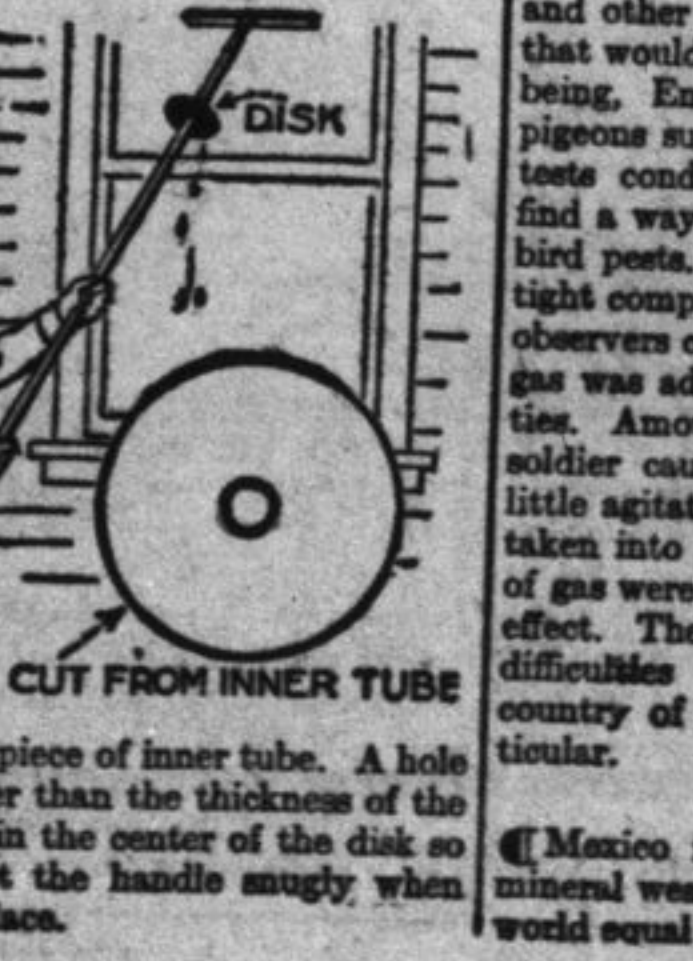
