**Rockwood Bowling.**  
Bowling has not yet started at Rockwood hospital though arrangements are well under way. Posters regarding the big tournament there on July 14th and 15th are being prepared.

**Injured Men Improving.**  
Hemmel Benn, Napanee, who was seriously injured in a motor accident three weeks ago, at the William street level crossing in Cobourg, is still in the Cobourg Hospital, but is progressing nicely towards recovery.

**Still No Jail Prisoners.**

**Summer Time Defeated.**  
A by-law to institute daylight saving in Smith's Falls was lost on third reading in the council of the town. Petitions against the measure carrying a total of 1,070 names were presented. They were largely signed by employees of Frost & Wood, Limited, the C.P.R., Northern Buttons, Limited, and by women of the town.

**Courts Sit Next Week.**  
The King's birthday week promises to be a busy one at the Court House. The supreme court opens on Monday afternoon and, if not finished with its three cases, will resume again on Wednesday. The June session of the county council opens on Wednesday morning at nine o'clock (county time) and will likely run till the end of the week. A session of the Division Court is also set for Wednesday morning.

**Champion Cheese Man.**  
At a picnic held by the Marmora Agricultural Society, presentation was made to John Finnegan of a gold watch suitably engraved, with chain, as recognition by the county of the distinction in having won the prize in the Old Country for the best cheese made in Canada. The presentation was made by C. S. Rollins, warden of the county of Hastings. G. G. Publow, Kingston, was a speaker.

**Dairy Co. Incorporated.**  
The Spencerville Co-operative Dairy Company, Limited, has been granted a provincial charter with capital of \$10,000 and with the following incorporators: Frederick G. Bennett, Charles J. McGuire, Charles W. Newman, John E. Lawrence and Andrew A. Goodin, farmers, and Leslie C. Mussel, cheesemaker, all of the township of Edwardsburg. The head office is at Spencerville.

**Change in Address.**  
The postmaster has received notification from Ottawa to the effect that the official name of the country formerly known as Russia has been changed to "L'Union des Republique Socialistes Socialistes," the abbreviation for which is "U.R.S.S." (Union of Soviet Socialist Republics), and that this address, instead of Russia, should be used on all correspondence for that country.

**Late George J. Gourlay.**  
The death occurred at Eganville on May 27th of George Johnston Gourlay. Deceased was born in Perth seventy-two years ago and when a young man moved to Eganville with his parents, the late Mr. and Mrs. George Gourlay, and later went to Pembroke where he learned the harness making trade. For the past fifty years he conducted a harness shop. Surviving are his widow, formerly Alice Meikle, and two daughters in Eganville.

**Accused of Negligence.**  
W. D. Morrison, Pembroke, will stand trial for causing, through negligence, the fire which gutted his harness shop in the Hunter block recently. W. H. Williams, K.C., appearing for the defence, moved for dismissal, stating that the act of throwing away a match even if it was not entirely extinguished, did not make a man criminally negligent, and claimed that if it did there would be hundreds of smokers liable to face the same charge every day.

**Struck by Falling Shovel.**  
Mrs. Walter Billings, Lya, was hit by a shovel, falling from an overhead beam. It struck her head and crushed her arm. A day after she became unconscious. She was hurried to the General Hospital, Brockville, where an X-ray examination was made, and it was thought expedient to operate. But while preparations were being made, Mrs. Billings regained consciousness, and an operation was not considered necessary. She is now improving.

**Would Donate Ground.**  
The Methodist church has offered to donate the old Dundas street burying ground at Belleville if used as a park, and it has been suggested that a U.E.L. monument, a log house in cement moulding, be erected on this piece of land, and that it be called U.E.L. Park. This is about where Capt. John Singleton, the first white settler in Belleville, af-

ter the French period, located. Being on the main thoroughfare highway it would be useful for tourists. The whole matter will be considered at a meeting of the executive of U. E. L. Celebration Corporation.

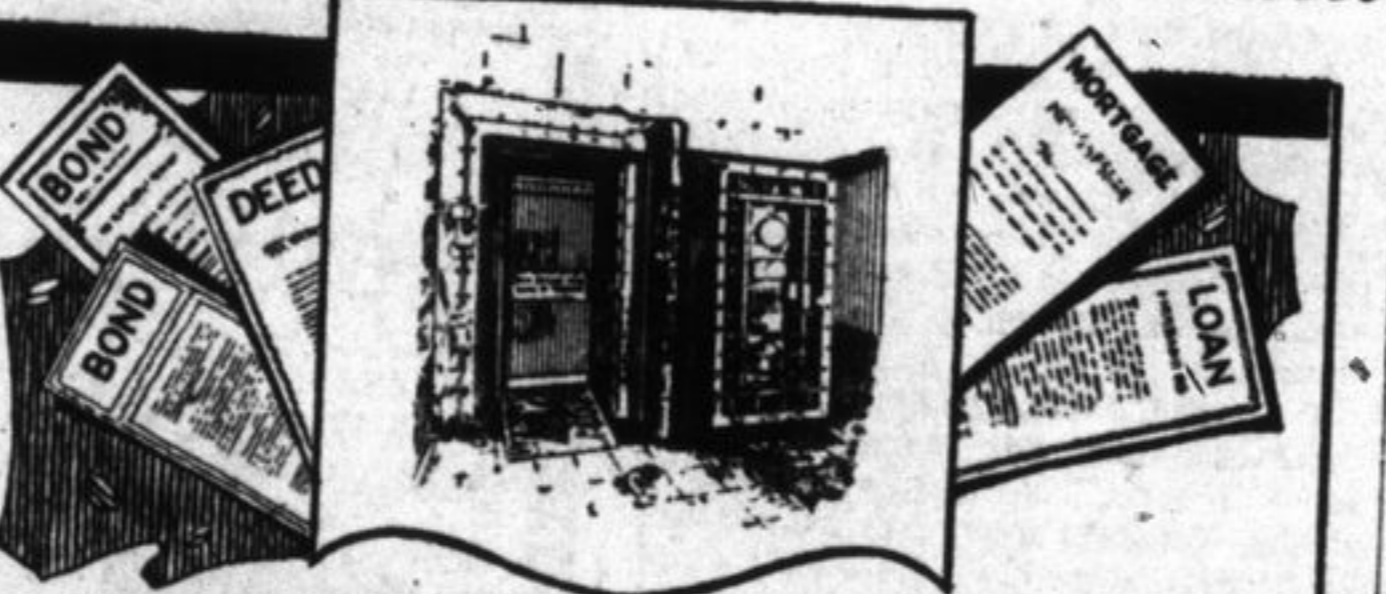
