Returns After Fifty Years.
After having been engaged for half a century in medical work in China, Dr. Lenora Howard King, Tsientsin, a native of the township of Lansdowne, is expecting to return shortly to Canada for the pur-

pose of assuming permanent residence here. She is now eighty-two years of age, and sometime ago disposed of her hospital at Tsientsin, established at the request of members of the Chinese royal family.

Nearly Drowned.
At Stirling, Jack Horton, aged four, narrowly escaped drowning when he fell into the pond, disappearing in seven feet of water. Mrs. David Burkitt, observing the little lad's danger, promptly jumped into the water, although unable to swim, and managed to bring him ashore.

Mrs. J. F. Bell Passes.
After about two years' lingering illness, Ethel Leona Mildred Stewart, wife of J. F. Bell, C. P. R. despatcher, Smith's Falls, and only child of J. Stewart, of the Customs department, and Mrs. Stewart, has passed away, at the age of thirty-one years. Deceased was a graduate of Chambers' Memorial Hospital, Smith's Falls, and very popular.

Cheese Price Drops.
The price of cheese fell back to 15 1/2 cents at Thursday afternoon's meeting of the Frontenac Cheese Board, at which all the cheese boarded, 303 all colored, were sold. Died of Heart Disease
Capt. E. G. Robbins, Clayton, N.Y., died Monday evening at his home in Fishers' Landing, N.Y. after an illness of two months, death being caused by heart disease. Capt. Robbins was born on Picton Island and always made his home on the St. Lawrence. He was married in Clayton fifty-six years ago to Miss Catherine Eggleston. Since he was a young man, Capt. Robbins has been a river captain, boat builder and contractor. He is survived by his widow and four children.

Eight Days to Kingston:
The trip from Montreal to Kingston, in 1822 of pioneers, a distance of about one hundred and ninety-eight miles, was made in flat-bottomed open boats, and occupied eight days, during which the passengers were exposed to the hot sun by day, the dew by night, coarse food, and no means of cooking proper food, not by any means the least, the course language of the boatmen who, when opportunity rose, imbibed freely, and were not pleasant travelling companions. During the trip the party slept in various places on shore, principally in the homes of settlers, and upon one occasion, in a barn.

Mrs. James Sheldon Dead.
At the family residence, Wright's Corners, near Athens, the death occurred on Monday evening, after a long illness, of Emma Wiltsie, wife of James Sheldon, and a very highly respected resident of the community. The late Mrs. Sheldon was born in Athens, seventy years ago, the daughter of the late Levi Wiltsie, and of Mrs. Wilson Reilly, who still resides in Athens, at an excess age of ninety years. Her marriage took place fifty years ago and she had been practically a lifelong resident of Athens and its vicinity, where she possessed a great many friends. She was a member of the Athens Methodist church.

Lumberman Is Dead.
John Clarke, Pembroke, died this week following a paralytic stroke. He had been ill for three years. He was sixty-two years of age and spent years in lumbering and farming. Thirty-two years ago he removed to Pembroke. He was an Anglican, a Mason and a Forester. A wife and one son survive, also two sisters and four brothers. When he moved to Pembroke, he became identified with Graves and Bigwood, of Nairn Centre, as their lumber agent and for over twenty-five years was connected with that firm. Of a necessity his work entailed considerable travelling in the North country and it was there that he was most generally known.
