### DIED FROM INJURIES.

**David Dodds, Formerly of Gananoque Passes At Guelph.**

Friends of David Dodds, a former well known resident of this town, son of the late Joseph Dodds, who previous to his death resided near Wilstead, were grievously shocked on Saturday to learn that he had passed away that afternoon at Guelph, where he had been residing for some years. His death was the result of an accident which befell him while at work in the factory where he was employed in that city, having been struck on the head by a falling timber.

Deceased was known here as a quiet, industrious man and as such was highly respected. Before selling out to go to Guelph he owned the residence on the corner of King and William streets. His wife, a daughter of Mr. Levi Williams, Charles street, and four children, one daughter having been married about a year ago, survive. The body was brought here and the funeral held on Tuesday. One brother, Mr. Wm. Dodds, resides here on King street and another brother, Mr. Raiston Dodds, resides in Vancouver, B.C.

### Calgary Provision Prices.

Capt. F. A. Reid, of the Kingston fire department this morning received a letter from a friend in Calgary which contained an interesting list of Calgary prices. Some of the quotations are: Veal 12 1-2 a pound; young pork roast, 12c a pound; sugar, ten pounds for \$1.05; round steak, two pounds for 35c; sirloin steak, 22c a pound; spring lamb—hinds, 28c, fronts 15c; bread, two loaves for 15c; eggs, 20c to 25c a dozen; butter 30c a pound. One merchant on the City Hall market advertises sirloin steak at 15c, round steak at three pounds for 25c and hamburger steak at three pounds for 35c; veal chops at 15c and pork for roasting at 11c.
