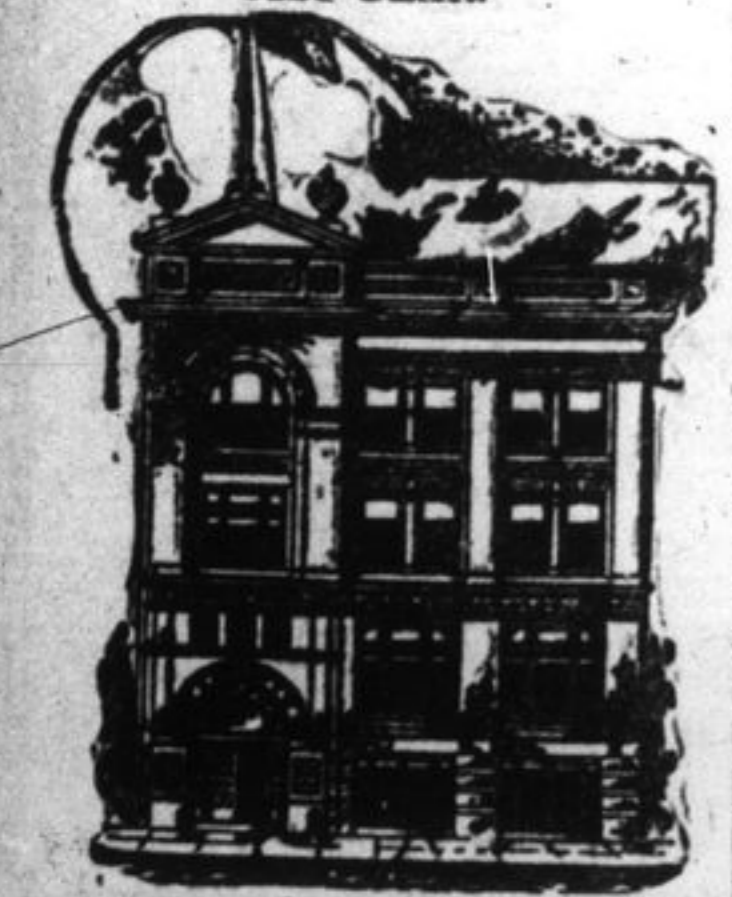

A CONTRAST IN TASTES.

The cowboys from Western Canada and the western parts of the United States who are in London, England, taking part in the steering-rope contests and other "wild west" events which are being staged as part of the programme of the British Empire Exhibition at Wembley Park, are being given a lesson in British humanitarianism, and are being shown that tastes for entertainment differ greatly in the two hemispheres.

CANADA'S PRECIOUS METALS.

To the end of 1923 Canada had produced over \$512,000,000 in gold. The prospect of rapid increase in the present rate of production is good, and there is reason to expect that Canada will soon become the second largest gold producing country in the world.

The opening up of the Porcupine and Kirkland Lake gold camps marked the beginning of a new era in the history of gold mining in Ontario, which is now one of the important gold producing countries of the world.

Canada's total gold production in 1923 was a little under \$25,000,000, of which about 90 per cent. was produced as bullion.

Silver comes second only to gold among the metals produced in the Dominion. In point of value of annual production, and among the silver producing countries of the world Canada ranks third.

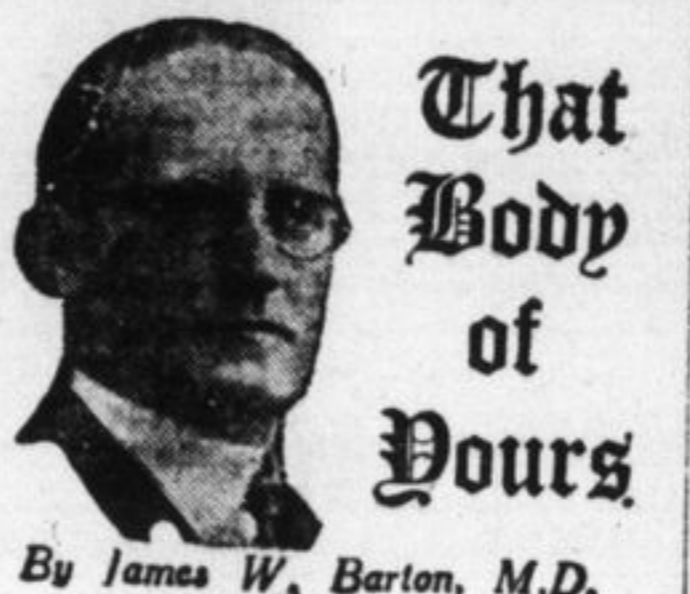
LORDS VERSUS COMMONS. Indications point to the Labor government of Great Britain facing in the near future one of the strongest battles of its brief and yet stormy career, a battle with the House of Lords.

The House of Lords, however, has no fear of general elections, and the bill has been so amended by the upper chamber as to render it practically valueless. The measure has been returned to the House of Commons with these amendments attached to it, and the government's intention is to move the rejection of all these amendments and insist that the bill be allowed to stand as passed by the lower chamber.

As the law stands now, the House of Commons has two courses open in dealing with the House of Lords. It can pass a measure and reject all the amendments inserted by the House of Lords, and if the Lords still insist on the amendments, the third passing of the bill by the Commons makes it automatically become law.
