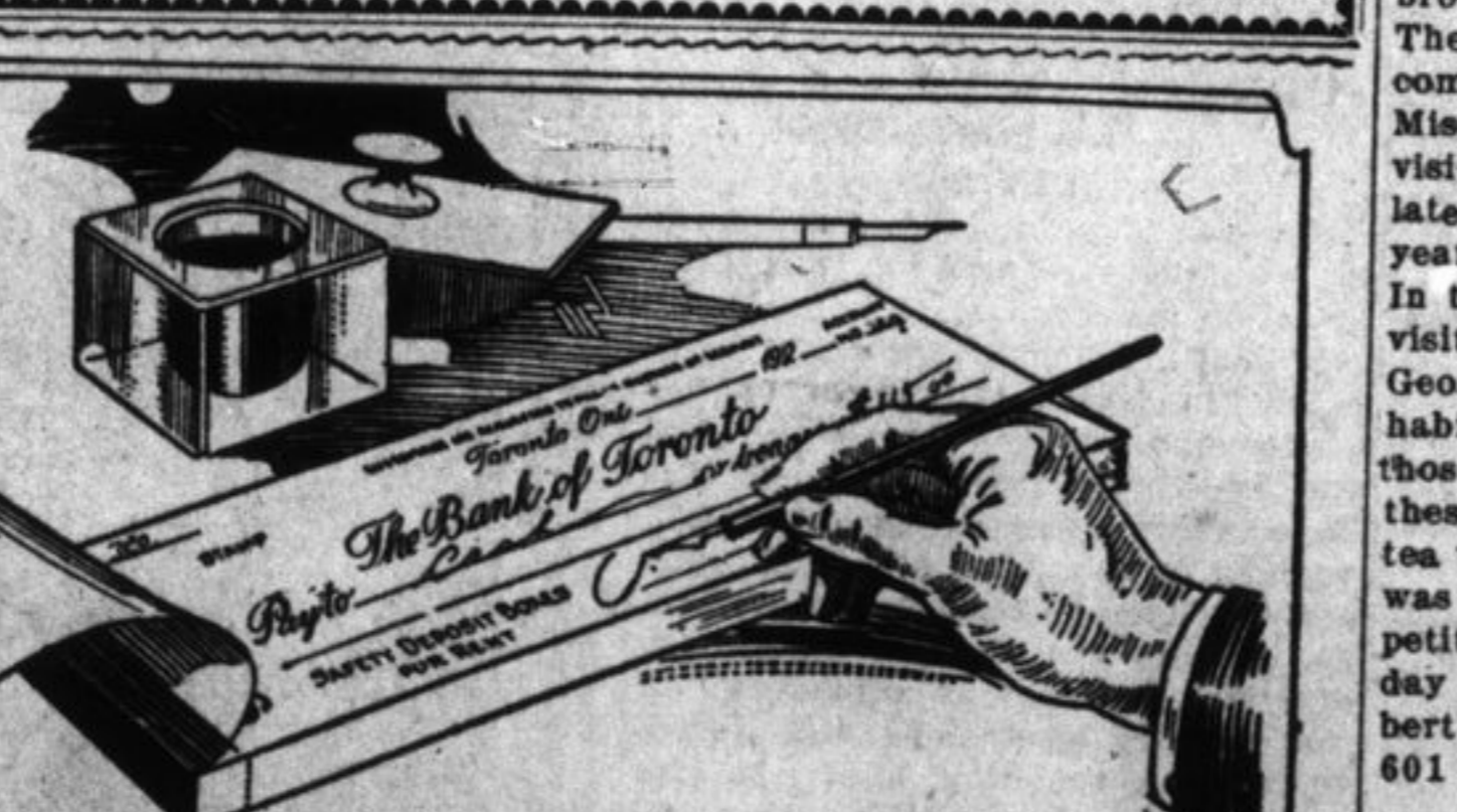
Pembroke District Entrance Results.
