FIRE AT PRESCOTT.

Lightning is Blamed for Blaze in a Storehouse.
Prescott, Aug. 1.—A fire broke out Wednesday night in a large stone building near the C.N.R., used as a storehouse by the McInnis Grocery Company. It is believed the building was struck by lightning during a severe electric storm which swept this section.
