What Horse Can Pull Shown by Tests in England

Tests made recently in England proved that a pair of horses, each weighing 1,600 pounds, could haul a load 550 pounds greater than themselves. On a metal track, one of these animals, it has been shown, can draw one and two-thirds times as much as on a good asphalt surface, five times as much as on cobblestone paving and twenty times the load it can pull or an ordinary mud road.
