CHALMERS W.M.S.

Hears Address By Mrs. W. J. Paul on Diamond Jubilee.

The Chalmers Women's Missionary Society held its first meeting since the holidays on Wednesday afternoon. The large attendance was very encouraging.

The speaker for the day was Mrs. W. J. Paul, president of the Kingston Presbyterian, who gave a most interesting report of the general council meeting, which she attended in Montreal.

It was the celebration of the diamond jubilee of the Canadian W.M.S. and was attended by representatives from all over Canada. Sixty years ago there was formed in Montreal a Ladies' Auxiliary Association in connection with the French Mission work of the Church of Scotland. In 1875 it was re-organized under the name of the Ladies' French Evangelization Society. In 1881 the society which had been wholly devoted to French work became an auxiliary of the Women's Foreign Missionary Society. Ten years ago a further advance was made when the Women's Home Missionary Society, the W.M.S. of Montreal and the W.F.M.S. amalgamated into the present W.M.S. so widespread in its activities and of such innumerable branches here and in foreign lands. No other organization has done a greater piece of educational work for church life. Ten years ago there were 52,000 members; today there are 95,000. How much is due the few devoted women who began the movement! The school homes and hospitals in this land have been a blessing to hundreds, while the work of the W.M.S. towards the uplift of the women in foreign lands is inestimable.
