The wolf, doubtless thinking discretion the better part of valour, slunk away to his lair. Aunt Dolly was in her girlhood days. Dorothy Phelps had come to what is now Phillipsville from New Hampshire with the United Empire Loyalists. W. B. does not remember what was said but he distinctly remembers seeing the wolf and says that it was in 1841.

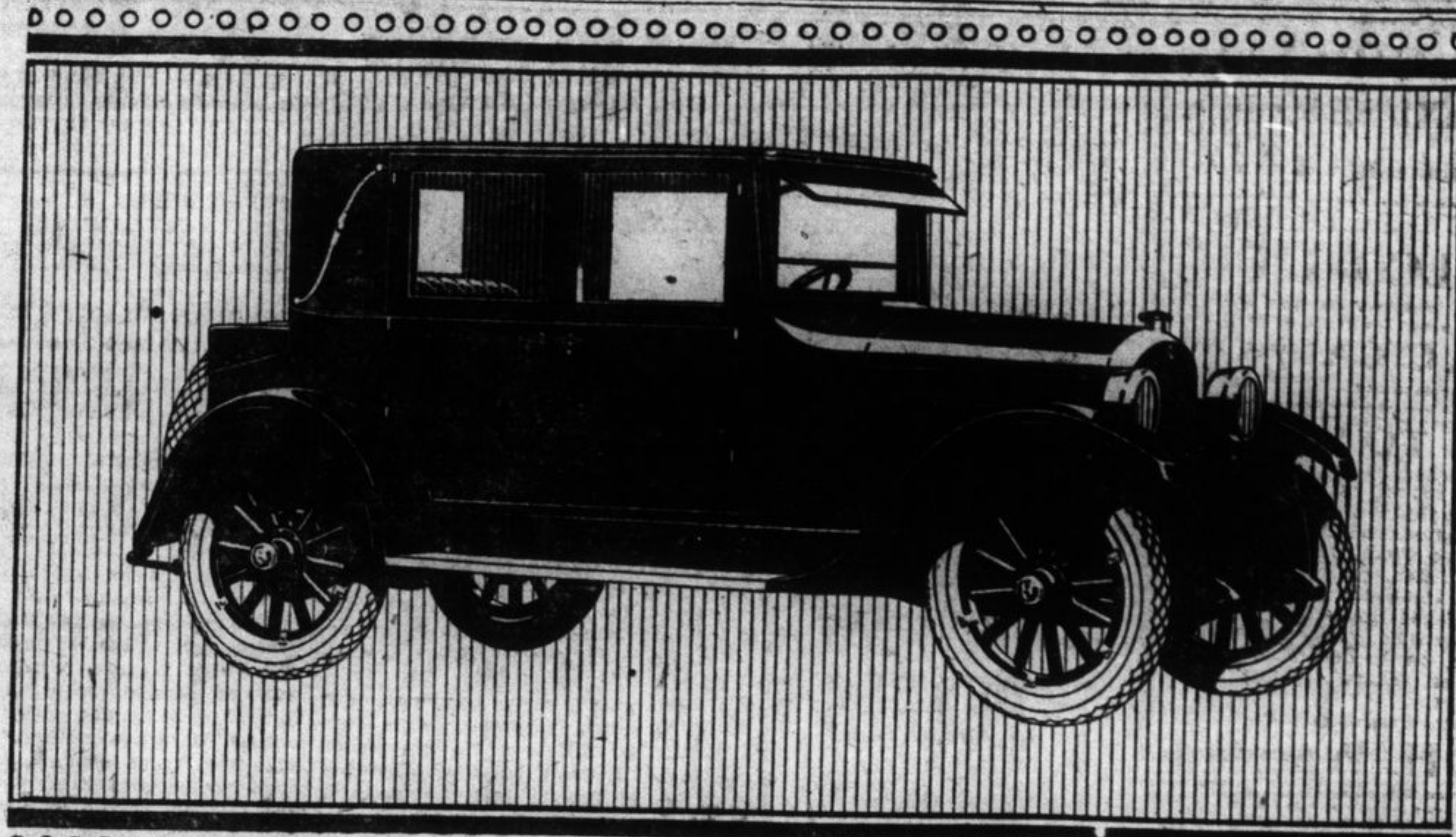

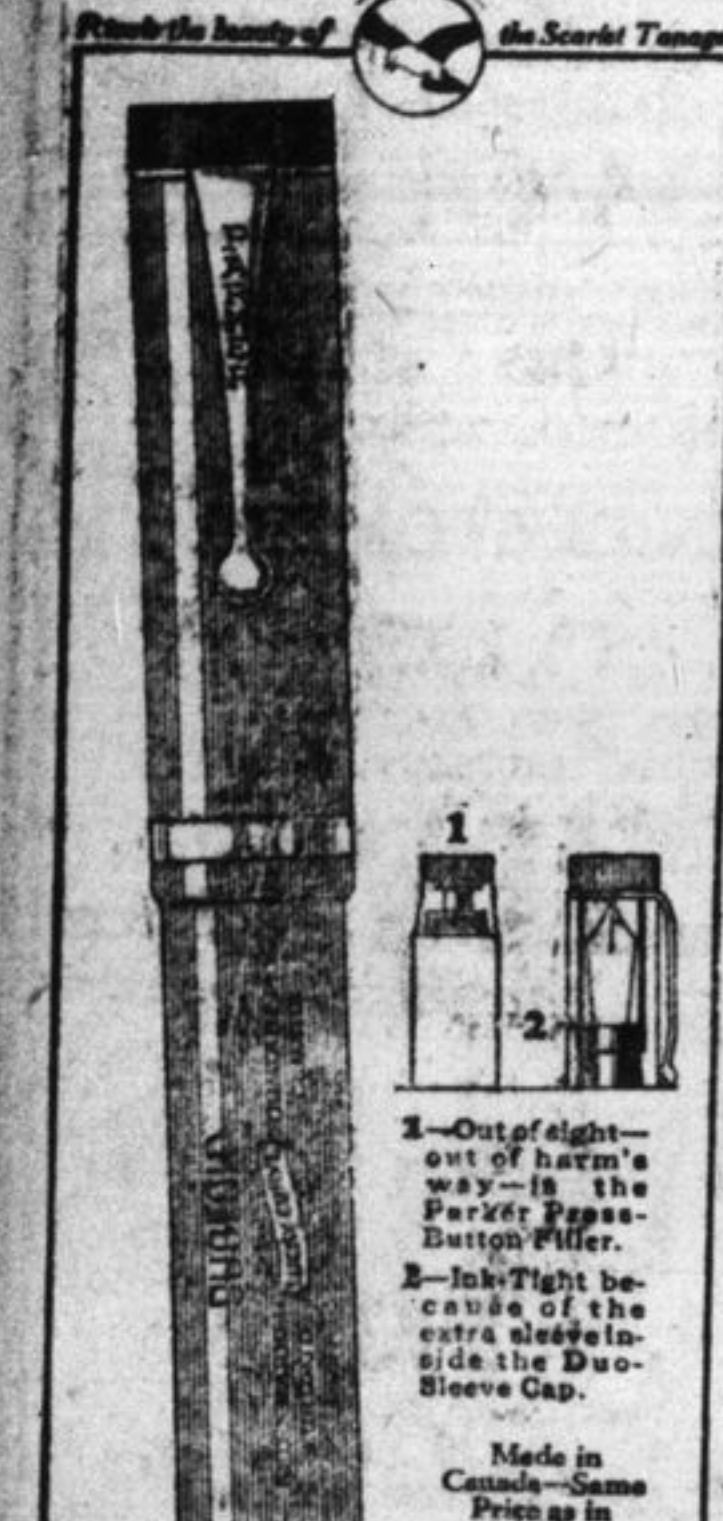

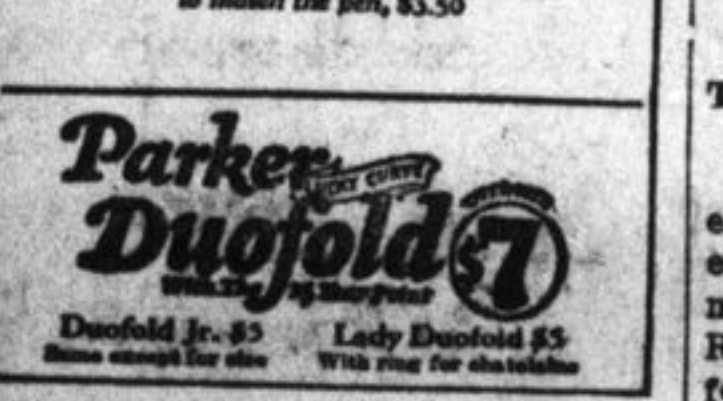
Most Miles per Dollar
