ARGUMENT CANNOT BE USED SAYS SIR HENRY

Regrets Bringing C.N.R. into Federal Politics in the United States.

Montreal, Sept. 25.—In an address delivered to the Chicago terminal committee, who were the guests of the Canadian National Railways at luncheon in the Windsor Hotel yesterday, Sir Henry Thornton, chairman and president of the Canadian National Railways, took occasion to voice his regret that the Canadian National Railways should have been introduced as a factor in the dispute between the major political parties in the federal election campaign in the United States.

After pointing out that the problem of success on the Canadian National Railways is almost entirely a problem of first increasing the population of the country to a strength sufficient to support the system, Sir Henry showed that this does not mean that the same problem faces the railways in the United States, and that therefore the success or failure of the Canadian National Railways could not be used either as an argument for or against the nationalisation of the United States roads.
