HE BOUGHT A BOTTLE FOR THIRSTY FRIEND

And for "Trafficking" Was Fined \$200 and Costs or Three Months.

An example of just how hard the O.T.A. pinches, was given in the police court on Friday morning, when a man was fined \$200 and costs, with the option of three months in jail, for "trafficking in liquor," the said trafficking being that he had purchased a bottle of liquor for a thirsty friend.

But the story dates back to the latter part of August, when straw hats were in fashion, and a reminder of the days of straw hats occurred when a tippler went into the prisoners' box, with a straw "lid" in his hand. Said tippler was arrested the last day of August, for being intoxicated, and as he did not tell the court where he had secured his liquor, there was no alternative for the magistrate, but to send him to jail for three months, or until such time as he would disclose where he had secured his liquor.

After spending a month in jail, the accused thought that it would be better for him to unburden himself of the "big secret" as to where he had secured his refreshments, and so he came down to Magistrate Farrell's session on Friday morning. And as he came direct from the jail, and had no time to go home and make any change, this accounts for his appearance before the Court with his straw hat.

Well, when the fellow was called to the box, to give all the important evidence as to where he had secured his liquor, he announced, much to the surprise of the magistrate and everyone in the court, that he had secured his supply at the home of a friend.

There is nothing at all wrong in having a drink at the home of a friend, and everybody wondered why he had refused to give his story.

But the curtain went up on Act 2, of the little drama, when another fellow was brought into the court room and charged with "trafficking in liquor."

"I plead guilty," said the accused after the magistrate had read the charge.

counsel for the accused, and he was stunned at the man's plea of "guilty."

"I guess you don't understand," said Mr. Smith, "you had better plead 'not guilty.'"

So the plea of "not guilty" was recorded and the case proceeded.

The accused "spilled the beans" when he stated that he had secured \$3 from his friend and had paid it over to another for a bottle. This brought about the trafficking and the six fell with a thud, to the tune of \$200 and costs, or three months in jail, and it looks as if the fellow will have to do the three months for trying to help out a thirsty friend.

"I guess the plea of your client was right after all," remarked the magistrate, to Mr. Smith as he finally disposed of the case, and both the magistrate and counsel smiled.
