## SPLENDID PLAYING IN YESTERDAY'S PASTIME

### Goslin Drove Homer With Two on and Had Three Hits Besides—Harris Handled Ten Chances Perfectly.

The analysis of yesterday's world's series game, won by the Washington team, American League champions, shows some sensational playing, most of it credited to the winning team.

By the win on Tuesday the Senators once more tied up the series making two wins each. First game went to New York, second to Washington, third to New York and fourth to Washington. At that rate there is every chance that the full seven games will be played.

In the batting in Tuesday's game Goslin, the left fielding idol of the Washington fans, was the undoubted hero. He had a perfect day with four hits in four appearances, one of them a home run drive into the right field stands which sent in two men besides himself. Goslin also had three good catches in left field, going to the fence on one of them to spoil a possible hit for a couple of extra bases.

"Bucky" Harris, the young manager of the Washington team, supplied the sensations in fielding. He had ten chances and handled all of them perfectly. Several of them might have gone as hits excusably but he was getting everything and spoiled some nice drives, completing the play with his quick throw to first.

Mogridge, on the Washington mound, held the Giants to three scattered hits until the eighth inning. Then he walked two men for a total of five passes and it was thought best to send Marberry in as relief.

Barnes started for New York and was derailed in the fifth in favor of Baldwin. Dean succeeded Barnes in the eighth. Muddy Ruel and Hank Gowdy, veteran catchers, com-

### PIGSKIN PRIMER

What are straight plays in football?

Straight plays are usually line bucks, in which the ball carrier runs straight for a given opening in the line.

Please explain the use of the term close formation. A close formation may be a balanced line and balanced backfield, that is, an even number of men on each side of the centre in both line and backfield. In an unbalanced line and backfield more men are on one side of the centre than any other.

In close formation the line plays shoulder to shoulder, the backfield men are grouped together and within five yards of the line of scrimmage.

What is the meaning of the expression punt formation?

In such a formation the outsiders usually are from four to 15 yards from the middles, while the other five linemen are close together. One man in the backfield is from eight to 12 yards back and the other three
