CHILDREN'S AID WORK

Capt. C. H. Buckland to Address General Meeting on Friday Afternoon.

The executive of the Children's Aid Society met in the office of the inspector at the court house on Tuesday afternoon. The resignation of Miss Mowat, on account of ill-health, was accepted with sincere regret.

Miss Mowat has been very much interested in the work for neglected children and it was largely through her efforts that the reorganization of the society was effected in 1922.

A committee composed of Rev. Father Coyle, director of Catholic Charities; Miss Ronan and the mother superior of St. Mary's-of-the-Lake, was appointed to assist Inspector Black in placing Catholic children in suitable homes.

A similar committee for the placing of Protestant children was appointed some time ago, the members being Mrs. A. L. Clark, Mrs. J. B. McLeod, Mrs. Frank Anglin, Mrs. MacPhail, and Miss May Chown.

Mr. Black reported on the visits made during the summer to the foster homes of wards of the society throughout the county and city.

He recommended the adoption of eight wards and advised the removal of seven children to new homes for various reasons.

It was found that five of the country children had passed the entrance examinations. Older children's agreements have been made in seventeen cases, a suitable wage being agreed upon for the year. About \$400 has been added to the wards' trust fund during the month.

A general meeting of the society will be held at the court house on Friday, Oct. 10th, at 4 p.m., when Capt. C. H. Buckland, the general inspector of the society, will be present and address the meeting.

Capt. Buckland was formerly member for South Wellington and recently resigned his seat to accept appointment to the new office of general inspector. Important matters concerning the welfare of the local society will also be discussed and all interested in the work for neglected children are urged to attend.
