 cuse, N.Y.

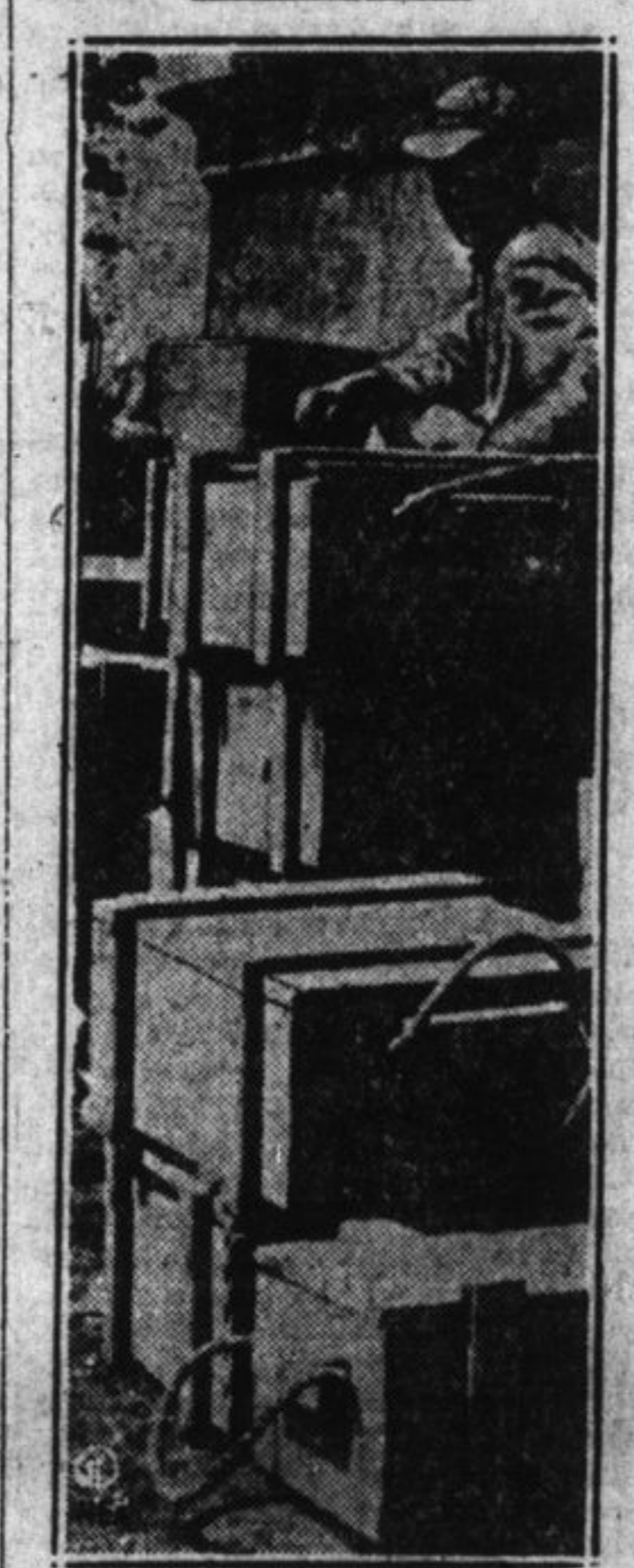
Island Property Sold.

Boundary Wall.
 A suitable finish to the old and
 historic Haggart mansion and
 grounds, at Perth, is being made by

 er around to the park boundary. This

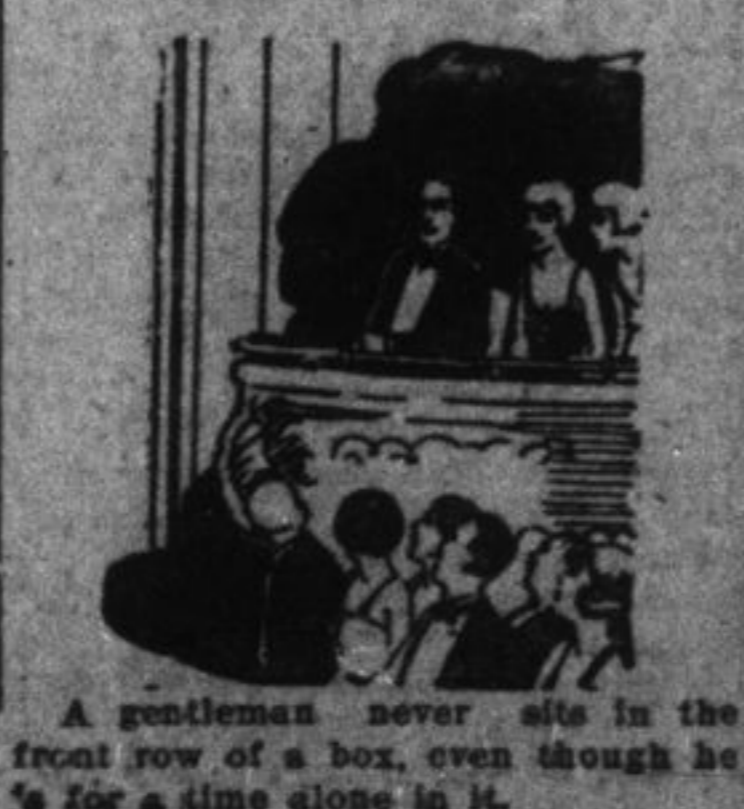


The Chekiang forces got their

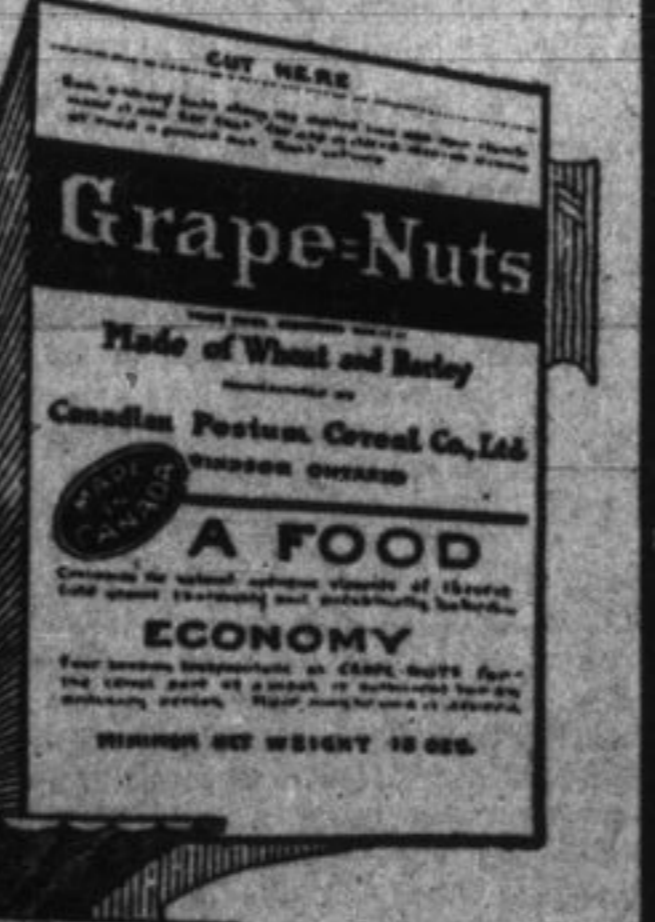
