The address, which was signed by Warden J. C. Ponsford and P. M. staff reads as follows:

"Dear Mr. Kennedy: The undersigned, your associates on the staff of Portsmouth penitentiary, take this opportunity, at the time you are completing your fifty-second year of continual service, of expressing in a tangible form their high regard for

"Some of us on the staff have been associated with you through almost your entire tenure of office; others have experienced the pleasure of your affable and loyal attachment to this institution for only a short time, and the association has been made so pleasant by your genial kindness under all circumstances that we have been moved to give expression to our feelings in this form
