## CONVICTS NOT TO BE HURRIED TO "PEN"

They Are to Be Granted Thirty Days' Stay in Indictable Offences.

The London Free Press has the following:

"Prisoners convicted of indictable offenses and lodged in county jails, but sentenced to penitentiaries, must waive their right to an appeal before the convicting justice or magistrate before they may be removed to the place of sentence.

"This was the information obtained by local jail officials who took the matter up with proper authorities following the refusal of the Portsmouth warden to admit Thomas Fox and Sylvadore Sansone. The new regulation, according to the information from the inspector of prisons, applies to all indictable offenses. Also the 30 days allowed for a prisoner to make an appeal is not taken from the term of his sentence.

"In view of the fact that a number of men convicted in these cases are of dangerous character there is placed upon each sheriff an additional responsibility, which may result in one more runaway being placed in all county jails. Previous to the regulation it was customary to remove prisoners sentenced to penitentiaries, within two or three days after sentence was passed. With the opportunities for escape much easier in county jails than in institution of the Portsmouth type there is presented a question that may ultimately result in an increase of the staffs of county jails.

"As for the local situation officials state that while the great number of their prisoners are for short terms it would work to a great deal better satisfaction should another man be placed on the staff to offset any likely chance of escape.

"At the present time the number of turnkeys at the Middlesex county jail is about six.

### MAJORITY OF 1432

For The O. T. A. In The County Of Frontenac.

Hugh Creighton, returning officer for the county of Frontenac, who made the official count in the O.T.A. plebiscite at the court house on Thursday, announce that the majority in favor of the O. T. A. was 1432. In view of the fact that the city of Kingston went "wet" by a majority of 1426 this means that the county and city combined voted dry by six majority.

Brockville, Oct. 31.—At the regular meeting of the board here 1,815 boxes cheese offered, consisting of 660 boxes white and 1,255 boxes colored. The highest price bid on the board was 17 1/2c per lb., and although it was 1/2c per lb. higher than two weeks ago, it was refused. At this date a year ago 2,558 boxes were sold at 15c, 19 1/2c and 19 5/8-16c per lb.
