SIXTEEN-YEAR-OLD GIRL BANDIT-QUEEN

Says the Rough Stuff Does Not Pay—Some of Her Philosophy.

Chicago, Nov. 7.—"Rouge has rough stuff beat a mile. There's no such animal as a sheik. Any man will hoof it plenty to see a yard of silk if the wind is blowing."

Such are samples of the "wise-cracking" philosophy of 16-year-old Evelyn Krueger under arrest here as the country's youngest bandit queen.

Sophisticated beyond her years, Evelyn tells a tale of lawlessness that reads more like a chapter from out of a Jesse James wild west novel.

What she wanted from life she took. But not once did she use a gun. She left the "rough stuff" to her gang.

"Rouge got me by," says Helen. "I used to give the dumbbells a beautiful smile. And they'd always fall because I had my lips all red-dened up."

"I'd steer them out where the boys were waiting. They'd do the rest. It was lots of fun."

Four of Helen's male companions—youths of 20—are in custody with her.

She was their leader. They say so. She boasts of it.

They have confessed stealing 40 autos, scores of holdups and a number of safe-cracking jobs, police say.

"We only took sedans," Helen relates. "I like the closed jobs best and told the fellows to lay off the other models."

"When there was nothing else doing we'd open a few safes."

A few months ago Helen was clerking in a 5-and-10-cent store.

"Whatta life that was," she reflects.

"When I got through I had to come home and fold my hands to look sweet for the folks."

"The angel child stuff was driving me cuckoo. I stood it long enough and then one night I ups and call my man. I was going to be married to him before long."

"Louis, I say, 'let's go.' And that's what we did."

"But take it from me, there's nothing in this rough stuff."
