Requested Scotch Recipes.

The following recipes were given me by a wonderful Scotch housekeeper. I publish them as copied from her cook-book.

ing bowl and add three tablespoons of pork fat (melted) and enough Scotch oatmeal to make a firm dough.

Shortbread: Rub together with the hands four cups of flour (pastry flour preferred), two cups of butter, three-quarters of a cup of powdered sugar and one-fourth teaspoon of ground nut-meg.

Curran' Buns: To one pound of bread dough add one-fourth pound of soft lard, one pound of currants, one pound of raisins, one-fourth pound of dried, finely chopped orange peel, one-fourth pound of chopped almonds, one-half pound of sugar, one-half teaspoon of caraway seed, one-half teaspoon of ground ginger, and one-teaspoon of cinnamon.

"It makes me look too matronly," one of the most fashionable women at the track replied when asked the reason for her failure to adopt the "Directorie." This probably sums up the case for the customers.

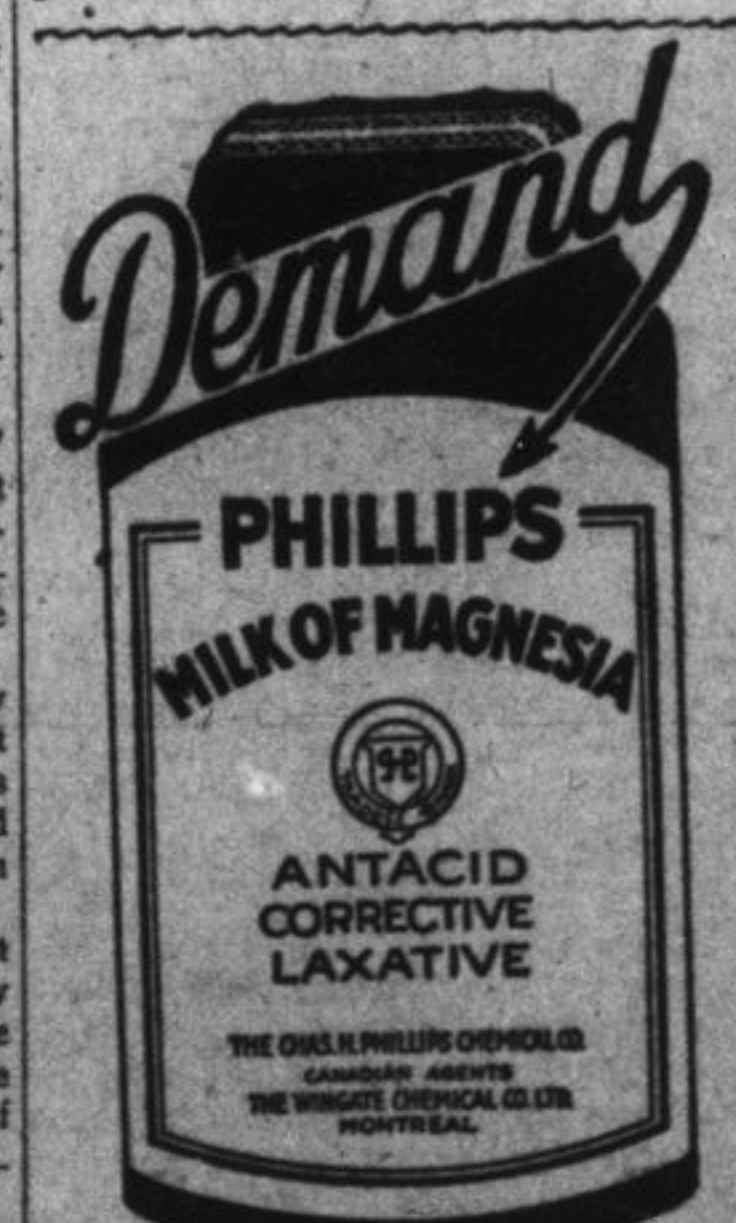
The milliners have come out flatly and have decreed that women must wear square crowns or nothing. It has become practically impossible to find a milliner who will make the stubborn little cloche.
