it in a mixing bowl; spread over the pork two teaspoons of soda, and over this pour one pint of boilinghot coffee. Let the mixture stand till cold, stirring it from time to time, then add one egg well beaten, one large cup of molasses, two cups of sugar, one teaspoon each of ground cinnamon, clove, ginger and allspice, and one-half teaspoon of mace. Mix well and also add one pound of citron cut small, one-half pound of chopped walnut meats and enough flour to mix quite stiff (I never measure this, so cannot give the amount!). Bake for one hour and 40 minutes, or there-abouts, in a moderate oven in greased pans. This keeps very well if wrapped in waxed paper and stored in a dry, cool place."


