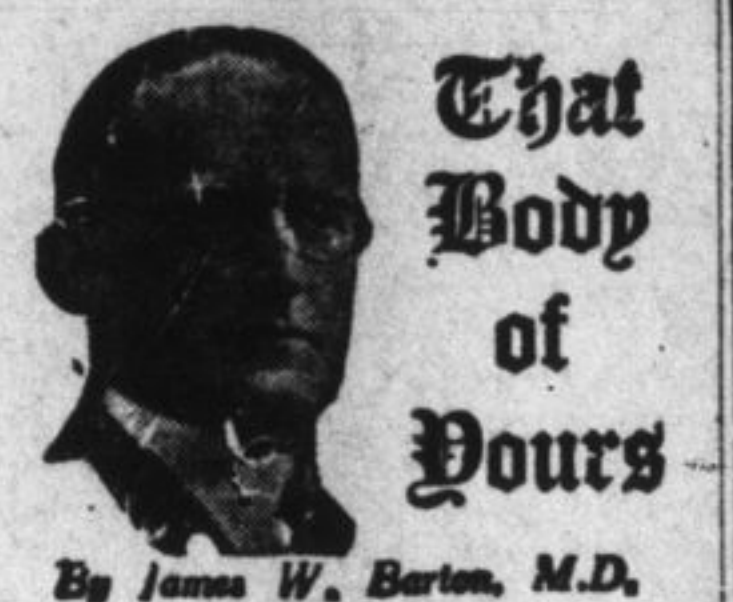
An Autumn Hint. After summer showers and autumn tropical cyclones are over, there is a period that is sometimes pleasantly fair but uncomfortably dry over a large region.
