The British make great advances in Flanders and Labassee is reported to have been captured. The positions of the Germans are mined and blown up by the sappers. The Germans are making another desperate attempt to regain a foothold along the Yser. The fighting is from trench to trench.

The Russians rout the German invaders and are complete masters of the situation. The enemy's fight was hasty and disordered. The Russians captured five batteries and an entire column of armed motor cars. Many German aeroplanes were brought down.

A Washington cablegram from British Guinea says the German converted cruiser Prinz Fitel Frederick was sunk on Friday.

Late advices from northern France on Friday stated that there has been no interruption to the Allies success in France and Belgium. All ground gained was securely entrenched and held.

It is reported in Amsterdam that a portion of the German fleet made a dash from Heligoland Thursday night in an attempt to reach the open sea, but the British line was reinforced immediately, and the Germans retired with the loss of two small scout ships.

Reports reaching France Friday morning tell of a decisive British Victory in Belgium.

The Russians have checked Poland's German invaders by fierce fighting.

Announcement is made in Berlin that the kaiser's temperature is now normal, and a general improvement of condition is noted.

It is stated that German submarines attacked the admiralty docks at Dover, England, but were driven off and two of them were sunk.

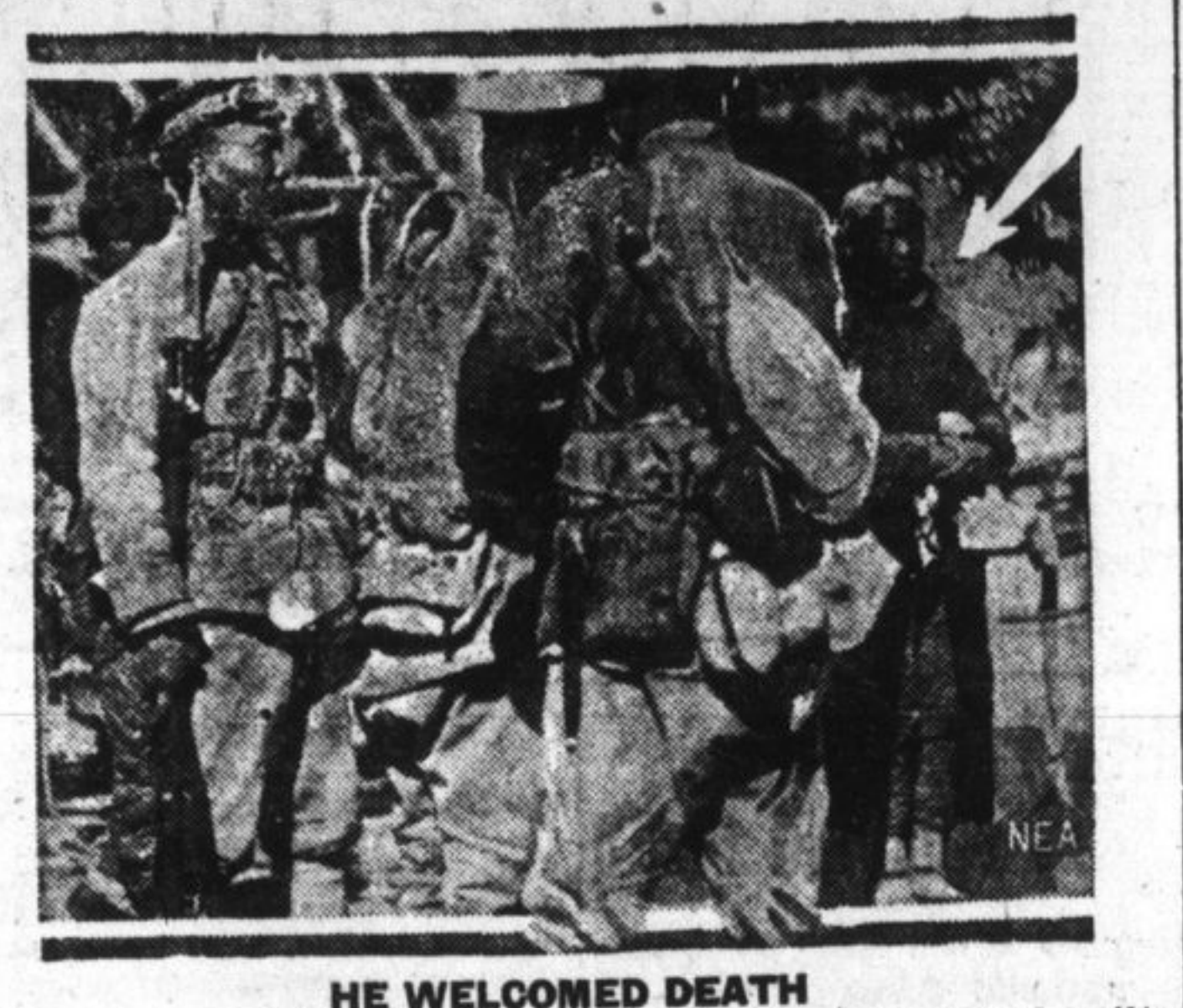

pressure is equally very slightly increased because the moon is pulling on the solid earth a little more than on that part of the atmosphere which is farther away. Thus, as the earth rotates, there are two high and two low atmospheric tides in the lunar day, just as, and for much the same reason that, there are two oceanic high tides and two low tides.

This minute variation of pressure was found only by tabulating the hourly pressures with respect to the position of the moon over a period of several decades. The daily heating of the atmosphere produces a pressure oscillation equivalent to the weight of several hundredths of an inch of mercury, while our ordinary storms bring us barometric changes of half an inch to an inch. Thus the lunar tide in the atmosphere has but 1-100th or 1-1,000th or less of the amplitude of the changes accompanying our usual weather oscillations. It is not difficult to appreciate, therefore, that the direct gravitational effect of the moon on the earth's atmosphere must be insignificant as a factor in weather.

**The Atmospheric Tide.**

To the ocean tide of a few feet, and to the land tide of about one foot, one must add the atmospheric tide, to complete the list of the direct effects of the moon on the hydrosphere, the lithosphere, and the atmosphere. As the moon rises in the sky it pulls the atmosphere very slightly to its side of the earth. This effect is enough, when the moon is at highest, to increase the pressure at London, for instance, by the equivalent of 0.01 millimeters (0.0004) or about 1-75,000th of the average total pressure of the atmosphere. That is, the gravity of the moon offsets by this small fraction the earth's attraction of the portion of the atmosphere nearly under the moon. Similarly, on the opposite side of the earth the atmospheric

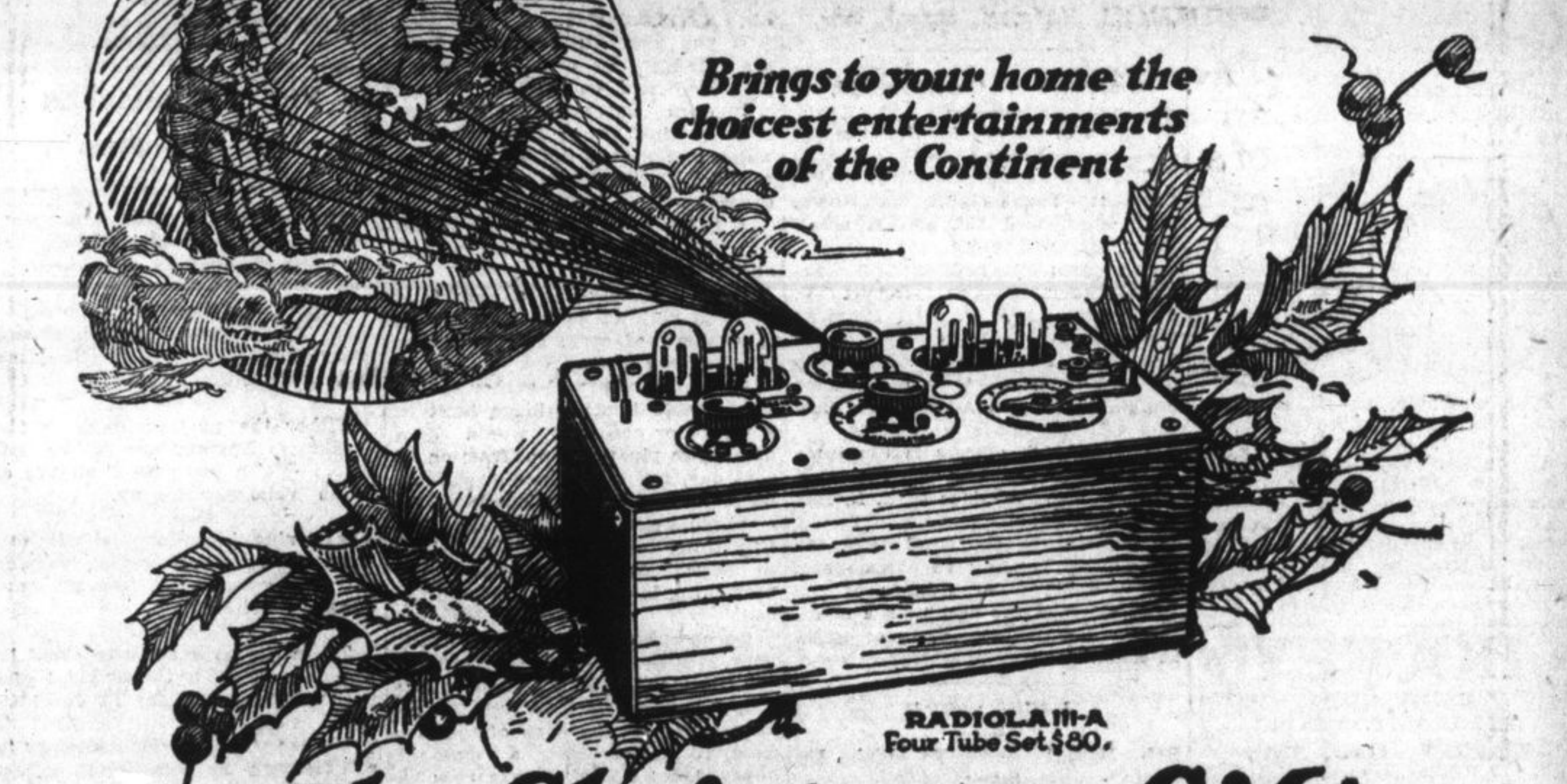
