But if your shelf is old and badly discolored, try the following excellent cleansing method: Make a solution of one part oxalic acid (POISON) and ten parts alcohol (or have your druggist make it for you), and apply this with a brush or swab; as soon as the stain on the marble disappears,

rub it with a cloth wrung out of cold water, then wet with ammonia. The alkali in the ammonia neutralizes the acid and stops its action. Do not permit the acid to remain on the marble longer than 30 minutes at the longest, as it will destroy the finish. Grease may be removed from marble with a paste of turpentine and whiting; cover the grease stain and let stand for some time, then wash off with soap and warm water. For general cleaning when badly soiled, use kerosene. Salt and vinegar also cleans marble, but the vinegar is acid and should not be left on more than a


