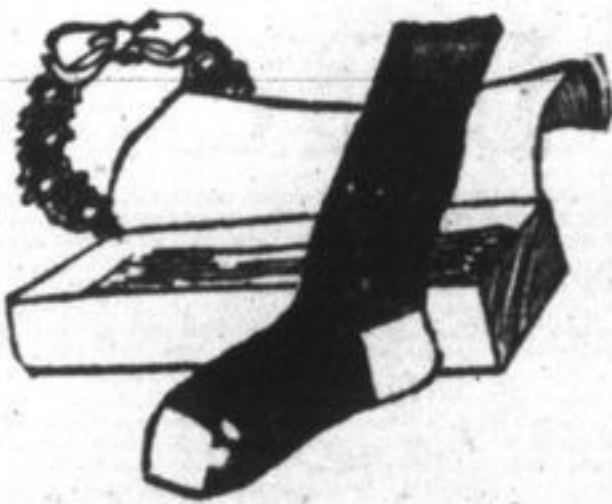

THE ACTION TAKEN AT A GATHERING IN TORONTO.

At the Ontario Municipal Electric Association meeting held in Toronto Nov. 26th, to consider the St. Lawrence development, Ex-Mayor Newman of Picton, presented a resolution pointing out that in a circular issued by the Canadian Deep Waterways Association, government ownership and control of power development was favored as opposed to municipal ownership and also payment by power users of the total cost of a proposed ship canal from Lake Ontario to Montreal.

The resolution, declaring the Hydro Association to be opposed to the methods urged in the Deep Waterways Circular as being an attempt to interfere with municipal rights and to place an unfair burden on the power users of the province, was passed unanimously.

At a meeting of the Canadian Deep Waterways Association in St. Catharines, Nov. 28th, the president of the association referred to the apparent conflict between the Hydro and deep Waterways Association and said he had not the slightest idea of interfering with the carrying out of the Hydro project. In conclusion he pointed out that a canal system on the St. Lawrence without the power development to bear the cost was an impossibility, that neither government would consider the scheme without the inclusion of the power development.

It is estimated that the deepening of the St. Lawrence will cost \$252,000,000 and will save the West \$12,000,000 to \$15,000,000 annually.

The circular, attacked by Ex-Mayor Newman after pointing out that the joint governments of the United States and Canada can borrow the money cheaper than Ontario can, reads "The people of Ontario (the power users) can well afford to pay the full cost of the whole project; in other words absorb as part of the cost of the power, the cost also of the canal system."

This is one of the big national and international questions: Should the Hydro over users of the East pay a double price for power that the Western Provinces and Western
