Dell never fails to arouse interest among the admirers of the works of this popular novelist, and in "The Unknown Quantity," they will find one of the most interesting and pleasing of her books. It is free from the depressing scenes she is fond of in which someone is flogging someone else, which in the opinion of many people mar some of her earlier novels. This does not mean that there are not plenty of thrills in "The Unknown Quantity."
