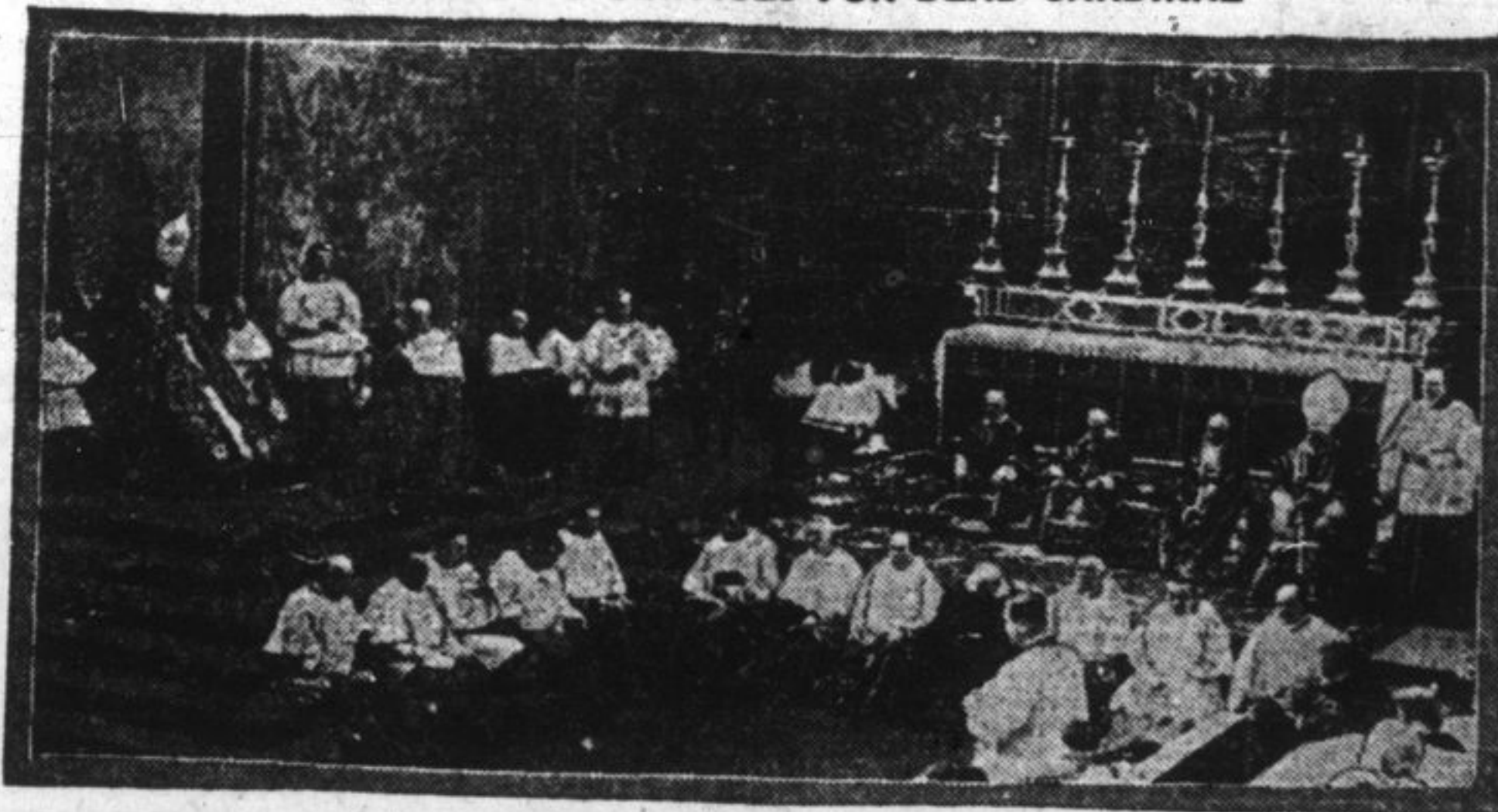

Kingston, Dec. 19. Notwithstanding the short space of time to arrange the show, it, too, was pronounced the best dog show in Canada. If space would permit I could eulogize all managers of the respective classes, all of whom worked with that co-operative spirit which meant success. Other outstanding citizens were Mayor Thomas B. Angrove, who was most untiring in his efforts during the operation of the exhibition; also Ex-Ald. F. Clow, who proved himself to be one of outstanding ability in assisting to carry out the programme in all its details. Also R. N. F. McFarlane, chairman of the civic utilities, who at all times took an active interest in the welfare of the exhibition also Collamer C. Folger, who with his able staff of workers were ever ready to assist in making the exhibition representing Kingston's 25th birthday one that may well go down in history as never before equalled in the history of our good old Limestone city. The electric work was in charge of James Harris, who was on his work twenty-four hours a day. Many of our visitors expressed themselves as to how well the lighting system was so successfully carried out. The last but not the least, the "press." I found the press ever ready to co-operate to its fullest. We of Kingston have every reason to feel proud of both papers. I submit they have no equal between Montreal and Toronto, and compare very favorably with even Montreal and Toronto. The editors of those papers are after all only human; it is conceded to err is human to forgive is divine; but from my viewpoint if every citizen worked as faithfully to develop our city as do the two editors, we would find ourselves pulling at the same time and all pulling together to make Kingston a "BIGGER AND BETTER CITY." For myself I can say I have tried

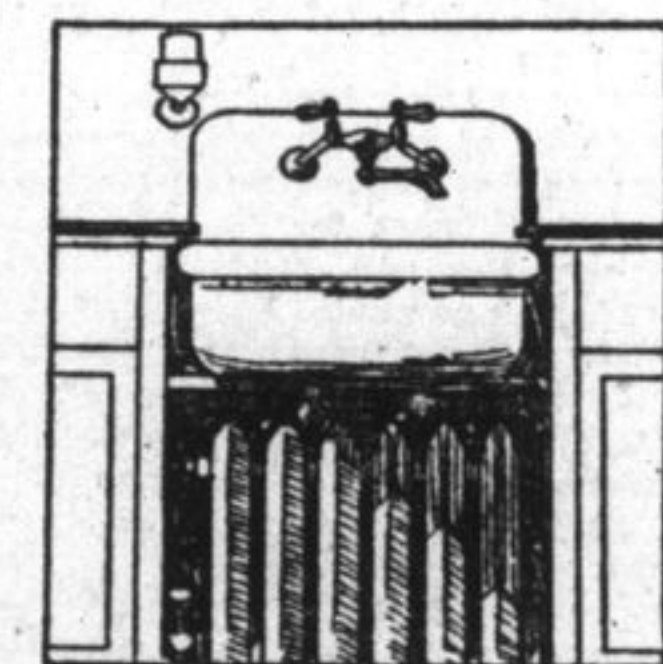

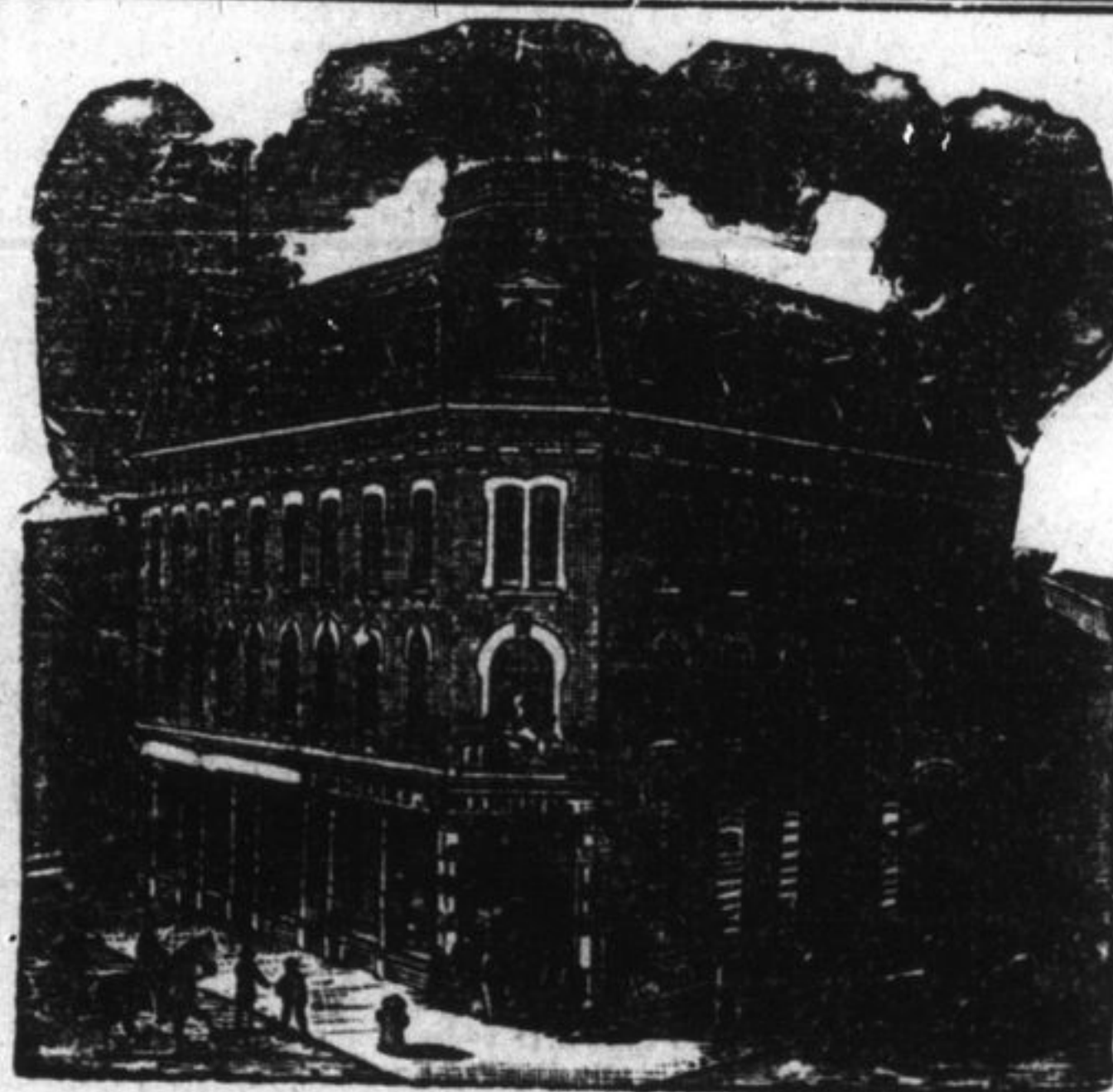
