Taking of Declaration Hereafter Omitted at First Sessions of New Bodies.

The members of Kingston's city council for 1937 have been sworn in and are now ready for the inaugural meeting of the council, which will be held on Monday morning, January 5th, at 11 o'clock.

The Municipal Act points out that the declarations of office must be signed by the aldermen within twenty days of the date of the election, and as the elections were held on December 1st, the time for signing expired on Sunday, December 21st.

However, the Kingstonians who sought municipal honors are not courting trouble or a fine, and so no objections have been noted regarding taking the oath.

DEGREE OF DIVORCE.

Seldom Ends Love, Says an Astute American Judge. San Francisco, Dec. 22.—Divorce does not necessarily mean that husband and wife have ceased to love each other; in fact the contrary often is true, in the opinion of Judge Thomas F. Graham, known locally as the great reconciler.

Judge Graham has been hearing divorce cases for 24 years. "It has been my experience," he said recently, "that love is not always dead when a woman sues for divorce. I believe that 99 per cent. of the women who get divorces leave the court room with heavy hearts. They love the men they have just divorced. I believe that when a woman once loves a man, she never ceases to love, even though she may testify most bitterly against her husband."

"A man does not have the power of expression of love that a woman has. Yet that love is there and it endures. When a father deserts his children, he is arrested. Almost as many mothers desert their children, yet we seldom hear of their arrest for abandonment. They should be."
