# IN REAR OF STORES

Old Wooden Buildings Near Corner of Princess and Montreal Streets Destroyed.

A semi-circle of tinned wood buildings in the rear of the Edwards garage/ Marshall's hardware, the Paris cafe, Lemmon & Sons, Dr. Chown's drug store and the Standard building, quite old and filled with stock from Marshall's and Lemmon's, were destroyed by fire a an early hour Tuesday morning, to-

gether with the contents. . Wooden-framed screens, wooden toys, quantities of oils and other inflammable materials made the blaze an especially dangerous one and this was heightened by dynamite and gunpowder inside the door of one building. Half a case of dynamite was carried out by one of the Miss Marian Riley and Miss Frances firemen and a quantity of blasting powder exploded without doing any great injury.

The first call came in at one clock in the morning from Box No. at the corner of Montreal and Queen streets but so far it has not transpired who sent it in. Four lines of hose were used, one from een and Montreal, two from Prinas and Montreal and one from in front of the Grand Cafe. A further like was laid from Bagot street through Dr. C. C.
