AUNT NET

Baked Tomato and Cheese Dish: Either canned or fresh tomatoes can be used in making this dish. Flavor cooked rice with hot, stewed tomatoes, stir in one beaten egg, season to suit individual taste with salt and pepper, sprinkle finely-chopped American cheese over the top of the dish and bake 35 minutes in a moderate oven. Serve hot.

In Cooking Beef Stew, in Thursday's dinner, try searing the raw pieces of beef before putting them over to simmer. By trying them in hot bacon fat, or beef drippings, until lightly browned on all sides, one is able to obtain a darker-colored gravy than is the case when the meat-pieces are merely simmered.

Hard Sauce (for Steamed Fruit Pudding). Cream one-third cup of butter and work into it one cup of powdered sugar; flavor with one-third teaspoon of vanilla extract and a drop of vanilla extract. Continue creaming the sauce till very smooth.

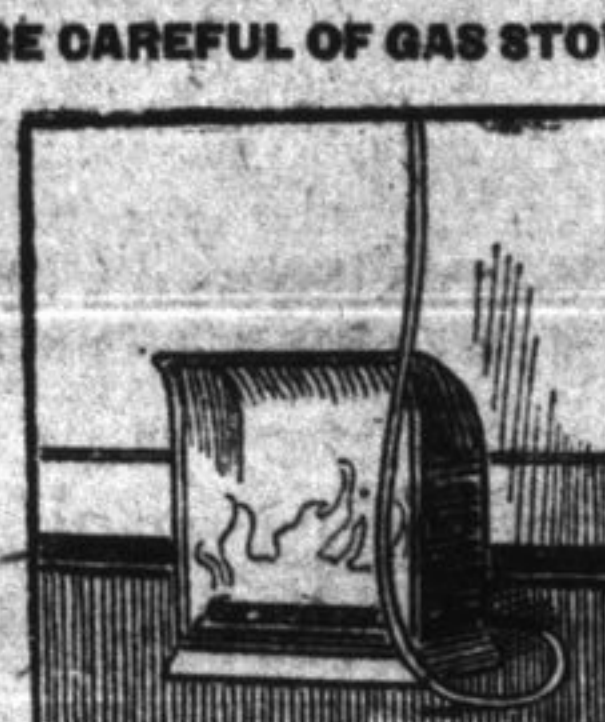
