

The Blakely was purchased from the shipping board and outfitted with the Lusitania job in view, but it was decided to give the diving apparatus and lights a preliminary test on the

Cape Horn wreckage. Salling from Hampton roads last winter, the Blakely's crew located feet of water outside the port of Pichidangui.

Eighteen trial descents were made. the divers remaining under water from 25 minutes to three hours a depths ranging from 194 to 318 feet. The previous record for deep-sea diving under working conditions was said to have been 182 feet.

The diving apparatus is of manganese bronze, with arm and leg armour ball bearing and hingejointed and the flexible sections composed of interlocked copper tubing wrapped and lined with sheet rubber. It carries air apparatus sufficient for four hours of immersion.
