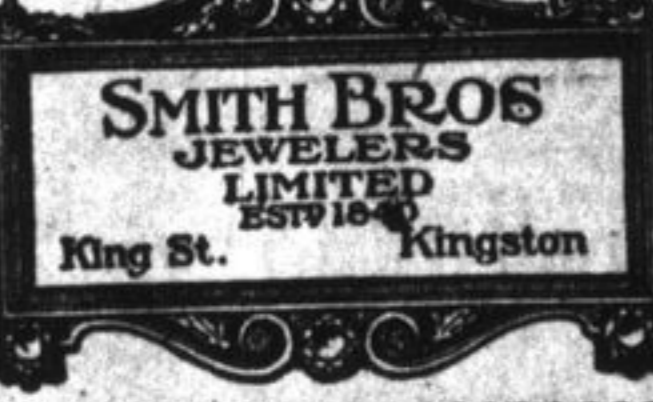

### ECLIPSE OF THE SUN.

Addresses To Be Given on the Subject by R. Meldrum Stewart. Radio enthusiasts who are interested in the total eclipse of the sun, which is to occur on the morning of Saturday, January 24th, may prepare themselves for the occasion by listening to a radio address on the subject by R. Meldrum Stewart, director of the Dominion observatory at Ottawa, who has prepared in advance a summary of the events to watch for during the progress of the phenomena. This address will be broadcast from four stations of the Canadian National Railways radio department as follows: Tuesday—CNRA, Moncton; Wednesday, CNRO, Ottawa; Thursday, CNRM, Montreal; Friday, CNRT, Toronto. The address will be broadcast from each station at 9 o'clock on the nights indicated.

### POST FOR CANADIAN.

International Labor Office Position Vacant. Ottawa, Jan. 19.—There is a vacancy for a Canadian on the staff of the International Labor Office, League of Nations. Hon. James Murdock, minister of labor, has received a communication from the director of the International Labor Office, stating that the office wants a Canadian as assistant legal adviser, to replace P. E. Corbett, who resigned in order to return to teaching work at McGill. The letter further requests the assistance of the Canadian Government in finding a suitable appointee. The salary ranges from \$3,670 on

appointment, by annual increases to \$5,405. Primary requisites are a sound knowledge of English law and jurisprudence, a good knowledge of international law and a thorough knowledge of French. The minister of labor is to nominate a qualified person to act with Mr. Corbett in judging the qualifications of candidates.

Scholarship is Offered. London, Jan. 19.—Emanuel College, Cambridge, is offering a scholarship of the value of £150 for original work by a research student who has already graduated elsewhere and is not less than 21 years of age. The offer is open to dominion students.
