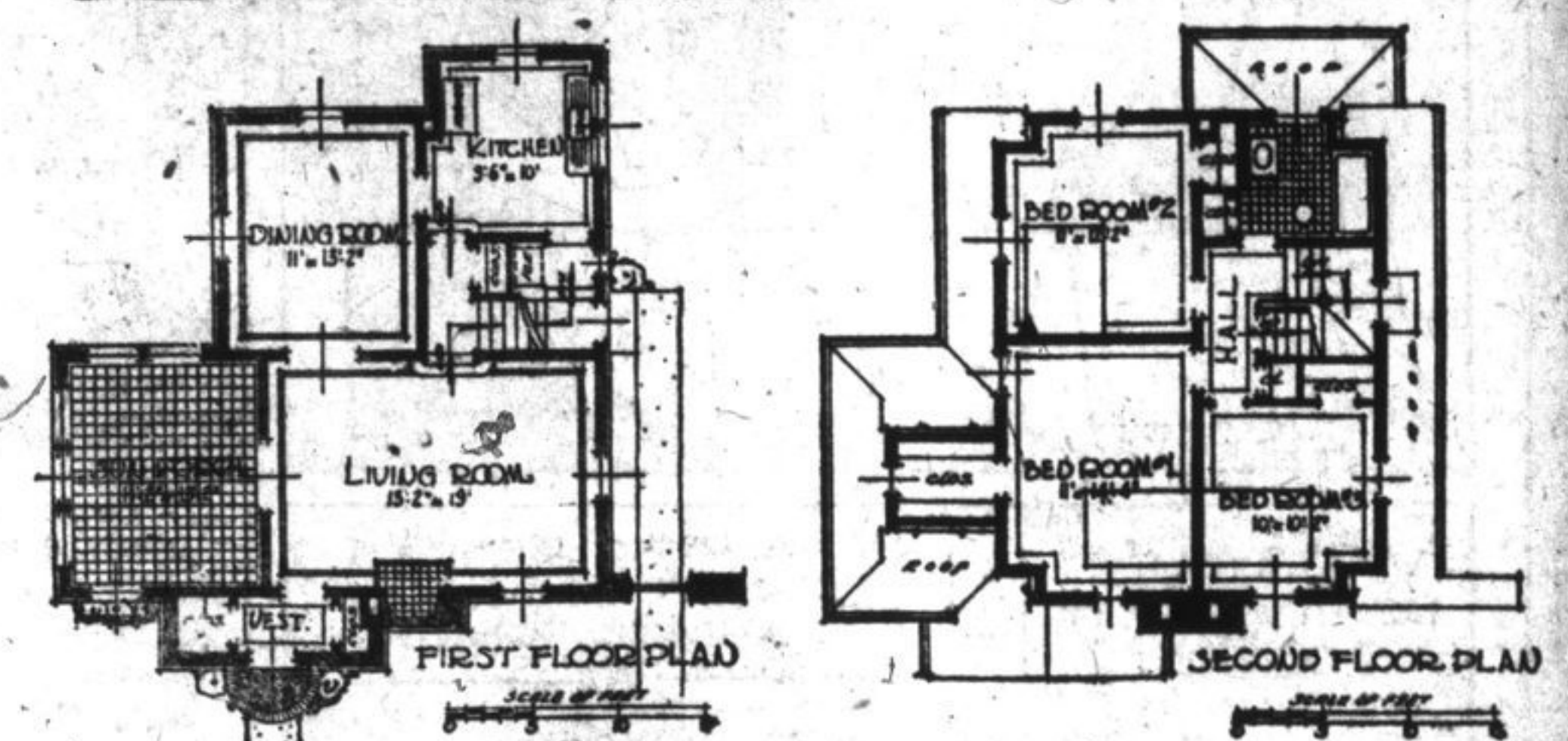
In concluding his address, Prof. McKenzie said: "I feel that there is no greater service an artist can do than to perpetuate the beauty of the athletics of his time."

The Family Market Basket

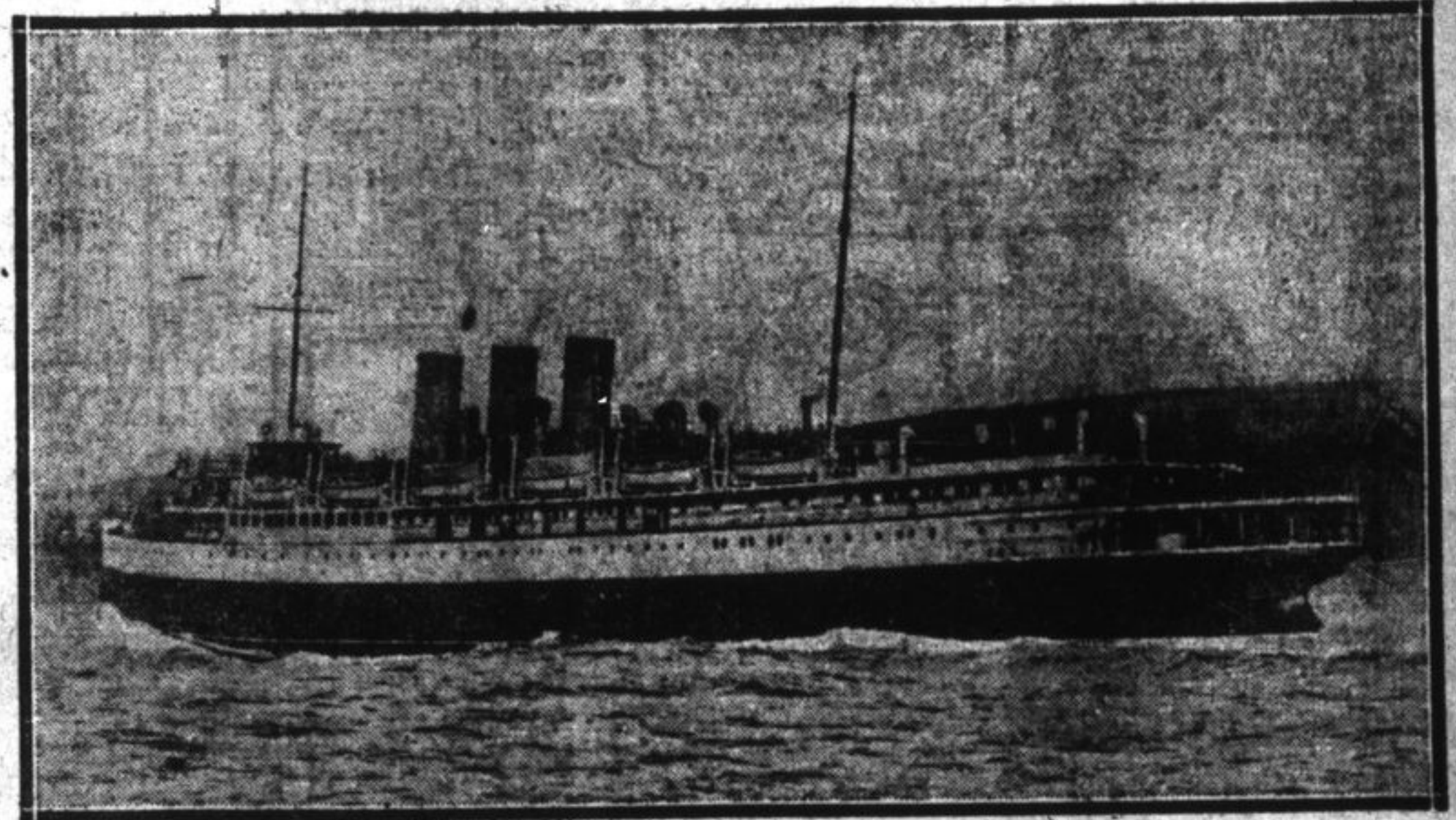
The island market was crowded on Saturday and the display of poultry nearly equalled that of the weeks preceding the holiday season.
