The old outfits of massive units and tangled wires served their purpose and was a means to the definite end of undreamed proportions. As time went on the units began to decrease in size, the number entering into the composition of a set fewer and results much improved. The greatest step in the advancement was the audion tube.

England Has Beet Sugar Boom. London, Feb. 6.—The action of the British government in granting a subsidy to the beet sugar industry is causing the erection of a number of new factories in various parts of the country. Work will be begun soon on a \$1,750,000 plant at Bury St. Edmunds, British interests providing half the capital with the other half furnished by Hungarians.
