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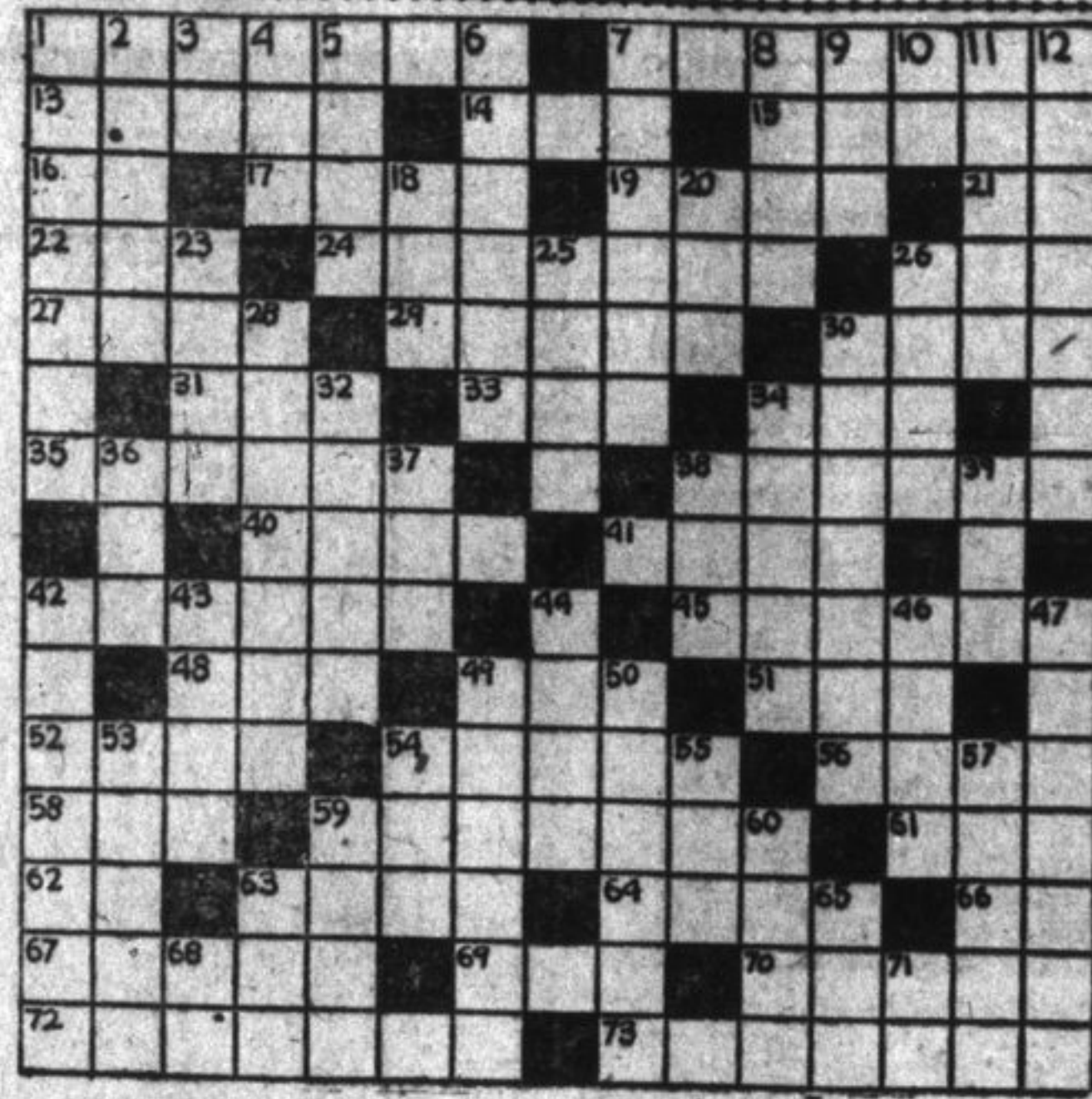
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CROSS-WORD PUZZLE

Fancy Gear Shifting. A car can be shifted from low to second to high and back again to second without pushing out the clutch. Just a matter of regulating engine speed to match gear speeds when passing gear shift lever through neutral position. If lubricant in gear box is cold and stiff clutch may have to be used at first.
