Divorce in Britain. Vancouver Province. The Jeremiahs who have been warning Great Britain that she was going straight to perdition through the divorce courts, will now have to find a new text for their preachments. Divorce is going out of fashion. Last term, in England, there were 318 cases on the Divorce Court list. At the present term they are far below those of two years ago, when nearly 3,000 divorces were sought.

A peculiar thing about the petitions now waiting to be heard is that they are mostly those of wives against husbands, whereas, in the past, the complaints were the other way. A London correspondent suggests that the reason is to be found in the Matrimonial Act, which places men and women on an equal footing in the matter of divorce, while the old law favored the man. All the same those who looked for a largely increased number of petitions as a result of the new law have been disappointed. Perhaps the husbands are not really so bad as they were made out to be. Or perhaps it is the forgiving dispositions of the wives that have upset predictions.
